Finding God on Vacation

Sometimes being on vacation can separate me from God. It's like what makes sense in the world I am familiar with doesn't make any sense at all, when I find myself in another situation. I suppose there are many ways that this can happen. Maybe you have experienced this on Sunday morning in a small way. Sometimes what made sense on Sunday morning, doesn't make sense anymore on Sunday afternoon.

It can be disconcerting, or even disorienting. But in spite of the difficulty, I think that this is a good thing. It needs to be viewed positively if God seems to sort of disappear on vacation, or outside of the familiar. Because the truth is, I think, that that God will show up differently, and be experienced differently in different places.

It's too easy to begin to associate God with "my way of life". A familiar way of doing a church service, or hymns, or people. When that happens, when we go on vacation or find ourselves in the unfamiliar, it seems God has disappeared because the familiar has disappeared.

Here's the teaching. When you find yourself outside of the familiar, and feel disoriented, God may be actually SHOWING UP. But what you already know is blocking the vision. It's something to think about.

We live in a world that can be very disorienting, and unfamiliar. It's easy to complain about it. But that's how God shows up and reveals himself. And what it means it this: God is really showing up these days!

- ~ St. Paul's is in the loop with Otto Schultz about the Living Resources Program


NEW BUSINESS

After Grace, Ardith Barber served refreshments. September hostess - Marla Weichel.



Weers; December – Sherry Henrichs. **Work Day** – Carolyn reported that the group is small and they would love to have more ladies join them. They meet on the 4th and 5th Tuesday's of each month. **Baby Care Kits** – Marcy Barber explained that they have quite a few supplies but are in need of approximately 100 bars of soap which Jeanette Bures and Peggy Hemphill volunteered to provide. **School Kits** - Irene Gibson reported that all supplies were purchased this year in order to get the requested items needed to fill the backpacks. Donations will be accepted to help with this project. **College Students** – Sheri Schultis has reached out to all of the college students. **Eunice Circle** – meets on the second Monday of each month. **Kitchen** – there are quite a few bowls in the kitchen that need to be picked up.
