Pastor Mark read an article entitled "This Changes Everything" which was the theme for the 2018 ELCA Youth Gathering. Pastor then opened with a prayer. Members present were Melvin Beran, David Henrichs, Cindy Lottman, Allen Roelfs, Jean Schmidt, and Jamie Schultis. Allen moved to accept the minutes, and Jamie seconded. Motion passed.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT

Allen reported that the current balance is \$1,700.49. The Diller Picnic funds have been deposited. The Portico was pro-rated this month since family members have been removed from Pastor Mark's insurance coverage. The current bills will be paid by the end of the month, except for Pastor's salary which will be paid soon. Jamie moved to accept, and Jean seconded. Motion passed.

#### **MEMORIAL TREASURER'S REPORT**

Jamie reported that the current balance is \$13,312.78, including the month's interest. No financial activity for the month. The endowment fund shows a third quarter increase and an overall increase for the year. Allen moved to accept, and Melvin seconded. Motion passed.

#### PASTOR'S REPORT

- 4 worship services, 3 adult education classes, 2 youth group meetings, 3 confirmation classes, 1 confirmation service project, 1 baptism and pre-baptism meeting, 1 First Communion class/acolyte training, 1 Transformational committee meeting, 6 home communions, 1 Cluster meeting, 2 text studies, 1 Women's Bible Study, 2 "other" calls. No mileage.
- Pastor Mark will be taking vacation from October 22-28, 2018. Pastor has arranged for services on October 28 and the "on call" pastoral needs during that time.
- Pastor Mark will be attending the Synod Theological Conference in Lincoln on October 29-30, 2018.
- November 4, 2018, will be All Saint's Day service.
- November 11, 2018, will be Mission Festival service.
- Pastor Mark would like feedback on his sermons. Pastor would prefer a discussion with more content not just a thought of whether it was liked or not liked.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORT**

- Christian Education--have been planning the upcoming Christmas program which will include all the congregation.
- Diller Picnic Food Stand--there are now some meats from the picnic that will be for sale.
- Memorial--met to discuss possible projects: replacing the Narthex doors, making the bathroom doors handicap accessible, and replacing the light fixtures in the church area.
- Property--Dean Pretzer sprayed for weeds and dandelions...A Big Thank You!!; there are a few maintenance items and trees that need to be trimmed before the winter months so a workday will be planned once harvest is finished.

- The exterminator has been at the church for a second time. Council discussed how often to have treatments done and recommends at least a couple more be completed.
- Pastor Mark has planned a meeting with an individual interested in becoming an assistant minister.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

- Sunday, November 11, 2018, will be Mission Festival. Pastor Mark is planning the service. Council decided to have a potluck following the service and Sunday School.
- Pastor Mark is looking for an individual/s to help with transporting the boxes of quilts to Beatrice for delivery to Omaha.
- Council discussed having a second individual available to make deposits when necessary.
- Council discussed the findings of the Listening Process and Report. A copy of the report will be sent out to congregation members. After discussion, the Council decided to move forward. Cindy made a motion to accept the report from the Bishop and Listening Team and to move forward with the recommendations. Voting yes: Melvin Beran, David Henrichs, Cindy Lottman, Allen Roelfs, Jean Schmidt, Jamie Schultis. Motion passed.

Next Eunice Circle will be Nov. 12, 2018 at 1:30pm, November book. Irene Gibson will be study leader. Irene Gibson, Recorder










A potluck meal and fellowship will follow the worship service.



As a congregation, we will be conducting a food drive beginning now and going through the Advent season. Bring your food donations to the church – help us collect food for the needy.








### YOUTH PHILANTHROPY CONTEST
