I suppose if there is one piece of advice we hear for how to live, it's this one. Follow your heart. There is something about those words that hits home, even if we don't really know why or how. It's something of a “deeper” theme. But is this good advice?

For many people, “following your heart” might not seem very real world. Perhaps we're following some other easier path, or doing what is most expedient, or simply what might make us the most money. Or we just follow the current trends, or try to fit in. Follow your heart? What? It's not very practical advice after all.

And then for some, what “follow your heart” might mean is to follow your desires. The big word today is passion. To follow your heart is to find your passion, it's like you find that one purpose that sort of makes your life complete.

I think it's good advice as far as it goes. But rather than “follow your heart” as the premier piece of advice for how to live, maybe “heal” your heart might be better place to start. Deal with those wounds that bring out the anger and contempt. Our hearts can will the good. But they can also reject and destroy. It's good to know what's in there.

That's the work of God. To do the heart surgery required, so that our hearts are more open, loving, and have a passion for what is good. The spiritual work takes priority. Like all surgery, it usually involves some pain, but eventually....you heal. Then, following your heart is really great advice.

St. Paul Lutheran Church Council Minutes for May 15, 2019

Jamie called the meeting to order. Pastor gave a devotional prayer. Members present were Jamie Schultis, Cindy Lottman, Darin Weers, Allen Roelfs, Melvin Beran, and Tyler Wolken. The minutes were reviewed. Cindy moved to accept the minutes and Allen seconded. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report

Allen reported that the current balance is \$1613.01. The Norris and Solution One still need to be paid, but will be paid at the end of the month totaling \$417.84. Sunni Richardson was paid up for her services in guiding the Envision team. Council continues to pray for generous donations to bring the balance up. Tyler moved to accept the Treasurer's report and Melvin seconded. Motion passed.

Memorial Treasurer's Report

Darin reported that the balance in the account was \$13,326.57, which was the same as the previous month. The statement he received showed an interest of 0.00%. This isn't typical. Darin agreed to look into the issue and report back next month. No other memorial reports. Allen moved to accept the memorial treasurer's report and Tyler seconded. Motion passed.

- Pastor talked about the youth retreat that will be next month (June) out at Camp Jefferson.
- Jeanette Bures volunteered to be the church representative at the senate convention this year.

Vice Chairman Report

Jamie wanted to give a couple "thank you's" in this month's report. First wanted to thank the entire Envision team and all their time and effort of making this vision for St. Paul's possible. We all appreciate their feedback and look forward to working with them in the future. That Vision team included: Linda Beran, Jeanette Bures, Jim Damrow, Dennis Hennerberg, Jane Pretzer, Sheri Schultis, Melvin Beran, Marla Weichel, Pastor Mark, and Sunni Richardson. Another thank you was given to Tyler Wolken for his efforts in organizing and putting on the church garage sale. Lastly, a thank you was given to Cindy Lottman for her efforts and creativity for putting together the sign for Vacation Bible School outside the church.

Committee Reports

Christian Education- Vacation Bible School is still scheduled for June 3-7. The committee has met and they are excited for VBS to get started. Beth Roelfs has challenged the congregation to recruit any and all youth to come and participate in this year's VBS. The theme this year is "Roar! Life is wild. God is good".

Memorial- The lighting project is still being discussed. Darin is researching more options/fixtures/pricing.

Food Stand- Considering getting T-shirts made for the Diller Picnic. Council is looking into designs made by the Envision team. Will wear them throughout the picnic and while working in the foodstand. Look for a sign-up sheet to be out shortly.

Old Business

- The council is still looking for an auditor for the church before the annual meeting in January

New Business

- Allen brought up the idea of planned giving. Allowing for families to not have to worry about giving cash or check all the time and just do direct deposit or other forms of planning giving. The council will do more looking into this.
- It was brought to our attention at the Envision meeting by Dennis Hennerberg that the church's LLC was been inactive since 2001. While many of us were surprised to find out, this is something that is being further investigated by Allen. Council is also looking into how we can update our status and research if any other items have been missed from previous years.
- Tyler also asked if there has been any feedback on having a bible study formed again. There were a couple members that shared feedback, but Council/Pastor are looking into how/who this would function. Please share your ideas and opinions of this matter with a council member or Pastor. Tyler agreed to make an announcement on Sunday.
- Prior to the regular council meeting May 15, Council met with the Envision team to discuss their recommendations and suggestions. All members of the Vision team were present. Each member of the team had a part in sharing a piece of the Envision team report, including several offering prayers. The Envision team met six times and a small writing group met an additional time. The team's report in summary had numerous recommendations/suggestions for Council, Pastor, and the Congregation. The meeting with the Envision team lasted a little over an hour to ensure that this time was well spent in communicating the Envision team's report. The proposal was tabled in good faith that the council will take the recommendations and begin working on them prior to the next council meeting. Then at the next meeting, council will discuss the recommendations in depth and develop a plan of action. The Envision team's report along with a council plan of action will be shared with the congregation soon.

The next council meeting will be held June 12th at 6PM. The council is considering having the Envision team be involved in this meeting. Allen moved to adjourn the meeting and Cindy seconded. Motion passed. The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.

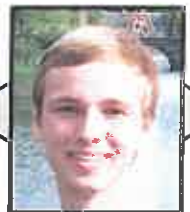

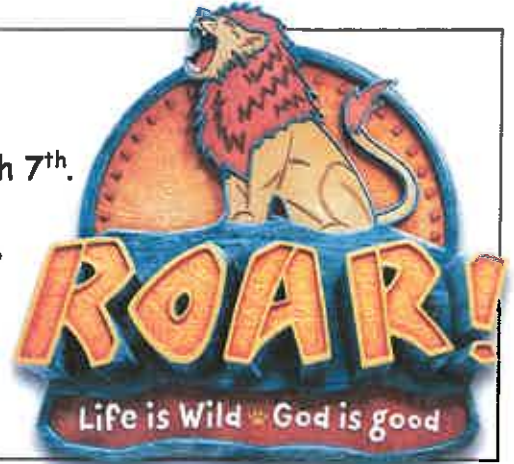
This year, the Youth will have a retreat at Camp Jefferson starting on Sunday, June 16 and will return on Tuesday, June 18. Come join the fun!!

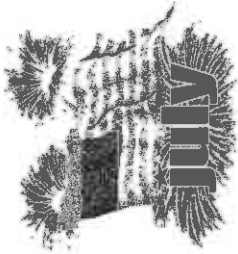

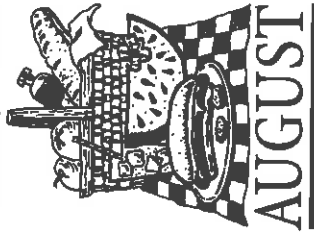
