Advent and Christmas: Learning to wait

The assumption of this article is that as you read this, you are waiting for something. There is something you want, something you wish for, something that you would like to see happen as you read this. It could be something as practical as a loan to be paid off, or something more personal like an inner sense of peace and contentment. You might be waiting for your child to be a little less rebellious, or your spouse to stop that irritating habit. But one thing is certain. All of us are waiting for something.

The assumption of this article is also that for you this waiting is probably experienced as something negative. A little build up in the traffic in Beatrice and you see people starting to get anxious and irritated. We don't like to wait. Waiting for us means that we are wasting time, that we are inefficient, that we aren't being productive. The gods that our culture worship have a simple message: "Get going! get busy! Do something! Make yourself useful!

But the truth is this: No amount of busyness ends the waiting. And the truth is also this: That all the things you are waiting for will never bring you what you are waiting for. For when all the loans are paid, and the people in your family have finally become what you want them to be, when you finally have enough money, or traffic lets up guess what you will find? More waiting. Waiting never ends.

For many people this may be discouraging. But the season of Advent and Christmas says something very different about waiting. The story of Advent and Christmas says that you are waiting, because God's Spirit is active and alive in you. We wait after all, because we have something like eternity within us. Stop the busyness. Just stop and wait. It will be hard for a while. But after a while the Christ child will begin to arrive. A sense of solitude. A sense that I can be content with what I have. The assurance that God is with us. And so there it is. It is in the waiting that we find what are waiting for.

My prayer is that you would receive the gift that Advent and Christmas bring season. The gift of learning to wait, expecting Jesus to be born in you. Blessings to you this Advent and Christmas Season.

New Business: Quilts, Baby Care kits, School kits and Personal Care kits are packed and delivered. Work Day is on Nov. 28th.



It was decided to sell the four large brown tables that have been replaced with the newer, lighter-weight white tables. We will offer them for \$30 each. Two tables have already been purchased leaving two tables to be purchased. If anyone is interested in purchasing one of these tables, please let one of the officers know.

It was reported that 45 quilts, 49 baby care kits, 48 school kits and 12 personal care kits had been assembled. We want to thank Kendra K. Weers for delivering these items to Omaha.

We are holding another drive for the local food panties during the month of November. There is a box in the narthex for food donations. If anyone would like to donate money, it can be given to Diane Wellsandt. We would like to exceed last year's donations of 370 items and \$550 cash.

Our women's Thank Offering Service will be held Sunday, November 21. Hanging of the Greens will be held on the first Sunday in Advent which is November 28 and we will be serving cookies following church that day.

Discussion was held about removing the Cradle Roll board in the narthex due to it being neglected and outdated. It was decided to remove it for the present time.

Officers re-elected for 2022 were: President-Ardith Barber, Vice President-Linda Behrends, and Secretary-Peggy Hemphill. Jeanette Bures stepped down as Treasurer and Diane Wellsandt graciously accepted this office. We thank Jeanette for serving as Treasurer the last five years.

In the spirit of Thanksgiving, the meeting was closed with Ardith sharing an "I Am Grateful For" poster to each of those present. We were to write something each day that we are grateful for on each ray of sunshine.

Notes were written to our college students and 15 college care kits were assembled to be mailed to them letting them know that we are thinking of them.

Offering for the evening was \$60. Refreshments were served by Linda Behrends.












St. Paul's Congregation observed All Saints Sunday during the November 7th Worship Service.


St. Paul Lutheran had a "Hanging of the Greens" worship service to begin Advent on Sunday, November 28.


