## St. Paul Lutheran Church Council Minutes for August 21, 2019

Jamie called the meeting to order. Council shared life/faith inventory stories with each other. Members present were Pastor Mark, Jamie Schultis, Darin Weers, Allen Roelfs, and Tyler Wolken. The minutes were reviewed. Allen moved to accept the revised minutes and Darin seconded. Minutes were approved.

### Treasurer's Report

Allen reported that the balance in the account was \$4,124.42. This is the balance after paying Norris and SolutionOne. Allen reported that there has been some very generous donations lately and very appreciative of everyone giving. All of the funds have been transferred over to the Odell State Bank.

#### **Memorial Treasurer's Report**

Darin reported that the account has been closed at the Heartland Bank in Fairbury and everything has been transferred to Odell. The current balance in the account is \$13,319.60.

### Pastor's Report

Jamie wanted give a thank you to members of the Outreach and Communication committee who went and visited the Filley church to get ideas about the Wednesday evening Sunday school program. Look to see the roof being under construction in the days to come. As a reminder, Council will be meeting with Megan Morrow on August 29 to have a Healthy Communication workshop.

## **Committee Reports**

Christian Education - This committee is partnering with the Communication and Outreach committee to develop an afterschool Wednesday evening program that would take the place of normal Sunday school for youth. This is in hopes of reaching more youth in the community and involving more youth at St. Paul.

Communication Outreach - This group did meet prior to Council. They discussed the possibility of having a healing service and having communion twice a month or every Sunday (Ideas only at this time). Ardith Barber also brought up the idea of having a Mission Sunday. This committee is new and is looking for ideas and ways they can help serve this church and its' members. Music and Worship - This committee met 8/21 prior to the council meeting. They discussed having more regular special music participation. Memorial - Darin has been in touch with Hartig Electric. He is looking at having them come down to the church and get a hard bid on the planned lighting project. As part of this project this group is also looking into having LED bulbs put in toward the front of the church. More info to come!

- Vision Statement Committee met July 31st and finalized their vision and mission statements for St. Paul. The mission statement that the committee came up with was, "To open our hearts and doors to share God's promise by transforming lives through our commitment and discipleship to Jesus Christ." The vision statement is bullet pointed, "1) Pray regularly 2) Study scripture and 3) Learn to hear God's voice". These statements were well received by council. - Allen did report that the air conditioner in the parsonage may need to be replaced because of discontinuing feature on it. Council will look into replacing the unit this fall.

- Pastor and Council are looking for a date in September to have new member Sunday. Watch for updates!

- The Outreach and Communication committee is planning on meeting with couples, families, and individuals to discuss grievances with the church and find solution(s) and build healthier relationships for the future.

After Grace, Cleo Perkins served refreshments.




