

Hope, Jefferson County Style

This past week a couple of our church council members were going through a bunch of old paperwork that's been sitting in our file cabinets for years. Some interesting things were found, but of particular interest to me was a book called "Wider Grows the Kingdom", a history of some 70 churches that had existed in Jefferson County up until 1967. It was published by the Jefferson County Centennial Committee.

Some of the histories are boring lists of pastors and building projects. Some are much more interesting and to my mind more candid and honest. Here we find stories of sacrifice and service, along with conflict and division. Some churches lasted, others did not.

But I would like to share with you the conclusions of the editor in the preface to this history. His name is James L. Green, and I don't even know if he is still with us. But here is his summary of what he learned as he put this little history of Jefferson County Churches together. Rarely have I heard a better expression of Christian hope. Take a little time with it, if you can. Remember, he wrote this in 1967.

"A wide range of theological differences are represented, but there is here (in the book) little evidence of the shifts in theology which have taken place since Christianity came to Jefferson County. Although some of the churches have been established for nearly one hundred years, the sermons, anthems, liturgy and other evidences of Christian beliefs from the last century, even from as recently as World War II, will not be found in these churches today. This is Christian history and it is a living religion. Knowing that it will change again and again; hoping that it will grow and develop; and observing that there is but one faith expressed with countless differences; we offer this history of the church in Jefferson County."

David moved to accept and Marcy seconded. Motion passed.

A correction was made to the printed newscaster minutes reported for the January 18, 2017, meeting. The newscaster reported that Jeanette Bures was present, but the council secretary's minutes did not report her at the meeting. A correction was also made to the printed newscaster minutes reported for the March 15, 2017, meeting. The newscaster reported that Scott Beran was present, but the council secretary's minutes did not report him at the meeting.

Treasurer's Report

Marcy reported that the current balance is \$99.47. A bill from Stanton and the April Portico needs to be paid. Jean moved to accept and Cindy seconded. Motion passed.

- The new Wi-Fi is working better. However, it does not work as well in the back areas.


New Business


