KIDS WILL DIG IN AT CROSSWALK


The students at this year's CrossWalk will be guided by a new curriculum called Dig-In. The lessons for 21/22 will focus on Epic Teachings of the Bible.

St. Paul Lutheran Church Council Minutes for September 15, 2021

Council members present were Darin Weers, Diane Wellsandt, Gary Bergmeier, Pastor Mark Liscom, David Henrichs, and Tyler Wolken. Not present was Peggy Hemphill. Pastor opened the meeting by giving a devotion. The minutes from the previous meeting were reviewed. Gary moved to accept the minutes and Darin seconded. The minutes were approved.

Treasurer's Report

Alan Roelfs was present to give the report. Total available cash was \$1,892.13. Bills still needing to be paid are Norris and Portico. This would leave a balance of (\$953.44). Alan brought up that we need to select a health insurance plan for Pastor Mark as a plan must be entered in by the October 4-15 time frame. The council discussed and felt that the Gold plan from last year was the plan to go with. Darin moved to continue using the Gold health insurance plan and Diane seconded. The motion passed. Gary moved to accept the treasurer's report and Darin seconded. The report was approved.

Memorial Treasurer's Report

Darin reported that there was an interest of \$0.82 which left a balance of \$12,773.16. Darin also reported that there was a donation from the Margery Keefover Memorial. Diane moved to accept the report and Tyler seconded. The report was approved.

Pastor's Report

4 worship services, 1 youth meeting, 3 confirmation classes, 1 funeral, 3 home communions, 2 other calls, 1 cluster meeting, 2 text studies, and no time spent at Fairbury the American Lutheran Church.

Vice Chairman's Report

Dave gave a food stand report and shared that the ELCA raised approx. \$500.00. A total profit of \$1,462.05 was made. 80% of that will go toward current and 20% will go to Benevolence. This based off of what was voted on at the last annual meeting. Dave also received a letter from our Church Mutual Insurance Co. asking if we wanted terrorism insurance. Gary made the motion to deny having terrorism insurance added and Diane seconded. The motion was approved.

Committee Reports

Christian Education- Crosswalk had just begun and had 34 kids in attendance the first day. Expecting more to come each week. They really looking for volunteers to help and fill in on occasion. If you are willing, please contact Beth Roelfs or Tyler Wolken for more information.

Worship and Music- The committee is looking at getting a choir going again and is discussing the upcoming mission festival.

Property- Doug Schmidt and company was gracious enough to help remove the dead tree at the parsonage. Darin and Brian are going to be hanging the sound barriers back up in the remodeled Sunday school space when they get a little more time.

Communication and Outreach- Family Funday Sunday was a success! A nice crowd was in attendance this year!

- Gary was able to do some research about a defibrillator. He noted that you can get a good one for around \$2000. The council is going to see about some funding from memorial, grants, etc.
- Pastor Mark signed the emergency pastor contract with the American Lutheran Church in Fairbury but has not been called in to step in.

New Business

- Darin brought up the issue with our occasional projector and internet issues. Pastor noted that the projector seems to be working fine as long as the internet is working and has a strong signal. Pastor made the comment that when people come to church, people's phones connect to the wifi which can slow things down. If everyone can be mindful of this and turn off your phones or disconnect from the wifi when entering the church, this may help the situation.

The next meeting is scheduled for October 20 at 7:30PM. Committee's are encouraged to meet at 7PM if needed. Gary moved to adjourn the meeting and Darin seconded. The meeting was adjourned and closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Wrestling with God

In the Bible, the story of salvation begins when God calls Abraham and Sarah to be the start of a new kind of people. Isaac is born, then Esau and Jacob. And then of course comes the famous story of how Jacob cheated his brother Esau out of his inheritance. But God chose Jacob, the cheat, to be one that passed on His blessing. It doesn't seem right, does it? Why?

Well, the answer seems to be that Jacob wrestled with God. One night he wrestles with an angel and won't give up until God blesses him. And it worked! He received God's blessing and a new name: Isreal. A name that means what? You guessed it: "wrestles with God.

Sometimes what it means to be God's people leaves out wrestling. Being God's people becomes more like inner peace, or something about being moral. There can also can be a niceness that creeps in, that makes it difficult to see God in the rough and tumble of our daily lives.

But when God decided to form a new people, he called them Israel. People who wrestle with God. There are so many issues today that we wrestle with, questions, concerns, problems. Difficult decisions to make and so much disagreement. We wrestle with so much!

What would happen is we understood that this is what it means to be God's people? To be "wrestlers"? What if we understood that dealing with these difficult questions and subjects was the way that we understood God to be at work in our lives? What if we learned how to do that together?

Sounds to me like it could be the beginning of a new kind of hope. Another way to be Israel, God's chosen people. Who wrestle with God together.
