#### Welcome Back, Pastor Mbasha!!



#### St. Paul Lutheran Church Council Minutes for December 19, 2018

Pastor Mark opened with a prayer. Members present were Melvin Beran, David Henrichs, Allen Roelfs, Jean Schmidt, and Jamie Schultis. Cindy Lottman arrived late. Jamie moved to accept the minutes, and Allen seconded. Motion passed.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT

Allen reported that the current balance is \$1,646.26. All outstanding bills have been paid, including Portico and Pastor Mark's salary. Other monthly bills will be paid by the end of the month. Allen will check with Stanton Propane about their bill before paying the due amount. The Blue Valley share of the Diller Picnic funds has been paid. The organists still need to be paid. Jean moved to accept, and Jamie seconded. Motion passed.

#### MEMORIAL TREASURER'S REPORT

Jamie reported that the current balance is \$13,317.80, including the month's interest. No financial activity for the month. Allen moved to accept, and Melvin seconded. Motion passed.

#### PASTOR'S REPORT

5 worship services, including the Hanging of the Greens Service, 1 Thanksgiving service, 2 confirmation classes, 2 youth group meetings, 1 service at the Kensington, 5 home communions, 1 Cluster meeting, 3 text studies. No mileage.

- Pastor Mark is working on how to present membership to discipleship for the Transformational Committee to the congregation.
- A thank you has been received from Guilford Wiemers for including him in the congregational prayers.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORT**

- Property--committee has been working on the water/snow damaged tiles in the front of the church.
- Nominating--committee is working on the annual meeting voting ballot for church council and nominating committee.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

- The annual meeting has been scheduled for Sunday, January 20, 2019.
- Schedules are being completed for church activities (ushers, acolytes, coffee, children's sermons) and will be posted when done
  with longer term dates.
- Cindy has purchased the Christmas treats for young participants.
- Council further discussed the transfer of bank accounts from Fairbury to the State Bank of Odell. The option will be discussed at the annual meeting on January 20, 2019.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

- Council discussed the formation of the St. Paul's Vision Team. Congregation members have volunteered to serve on the team. The
  group will begin meeting as soon as a mentor has been selected. Allen made a motion to seat the St. Paul's Vision Team, and Jamie
  seconded. Motion passed.
- The ballot for the annual meeting will read 80/60 with a vote for one between 80% current or 60% current and based on the current vote, a vote for world hunger or benevolence or BVCA.
- Council discussed the 2019 budget. A big change will be the insurance premium. Jean made a motion to propose the 2019 budget at the annual meeting with the increase to the organist's salary. Jamie seconded. Motion passed.

The next council meeting will be on Wednesday, January 16, 2019, at 6:00 p.m. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer. Allen made a motion to adjourn, and Cindy seconded. Motion passed






We need \$12,307.87 in CURRENT per month to meet the 2018 budget.

St. Paul Lutheran had a "Hanging of the Greens" worship service to begin Advent on Sunday, December 2.

It was a program written by a Pastor and used with permission of Good Shepherd Lutheran and Zion State Line Lutheran Church that gave the background of all the greens that are used at Christmas and during Advent. The program and worship service was led by the Youth, and many traditional carols were sung that associated with the greens that were featured.

The first reading was by Neleigh Weers about why we use the greens to decorate our church and the congregation sang, "Soon And Very Soon." The second reading was again by Neleigh Weers about the different colors and meanings of the paraments we use for worship. 
