Interpreting the Bible

"When you give a luncheon or dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or rich neighbors, in case they may invite you in return, and you would be repaid. But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind. And you will be blessed because they cannot repay you, for you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous." (Luke 14:12-14)

Ok, is it wrong to invite your friends over for dinner? Or your relatives? To listen to the way that the Bible is often used today you would have to come to that conclusion. You've heard the line, and it's still around. When all else fails, read the instructions.

But of course, this would be ridiculous. Even though it is "what the Bible says" and in this case "what Jesus says", most of us would be able to figure out that something else must be going on here. That this kind of rigidity is a sign that something has gone awry.

A quick point. It's important to remember that the Bible is not a substitute for God. The Bible never points to Itself as an authority. The purpose of the Bible is to point us to the reality of God given in the gift of Jesus.

Now read the text again from that perspective. Does this point us to the love of God given in Jesus Christ? Does it say something about the heart of God? Now we're getting somewhere. It's important to remember this when we are interpreting the Bible.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Benevolence has started over, so the amount looks small. Christian Ed good yet, Portico outstanding yet. No big expenses on the horizon. January giving was a little light due to the weather. A balance of \$10,483.62 in the General Fund was reported. Brian moved to accept the Treasurer's Report and it was seconded by Doug. Motion passed.

MEMORIAL TREASURER'S REPORT

Interest of \$1.68 has been received to make a total balance of \$11,678.84, after paying the doors and receiving endowment from the Synod. Were able to use several memorials and put them to good use. Thank you to those families who gave memorials. Allen moved to approve report and was seconded by Gary. Motion passed.

Pastor Mark brought up that input for a complete restructure of the ELCA is being gathered.





LENTEN SERIES 2024


