I Know that I Know that I Know!

A while back I was listening to a popular radio preacher talk about what it means to believe in God. And in the end, it came out something like this: "I know that I know that I know that I know!" He began in a normal tone of voice and slowly began to increase the fervor of his tone. "I know that I know that I know!" The cheering started slowly and soon the whole place was bursting with that kind of confidence that only absolute certainty can provide. This was the image of what it means to believe.

Hmm. I don't think this is believing. It is a form of a popular pep rally technique. You could use it at the beginning of a football game. Just get a big drum and start a beat. Boom, Boom, Boom, Boom. It does do something to you to be sure! It fills you with something! But I don't think it's belief.

The following is a quote from the leaders guide in our confirmation curriculum this year. And I think this is critical for all of us to get. Take some time with this if you would.

"Real life is a complicated undertaking. Very few of us enjoy perfect clarity about who we are and what we believe, and those who claim such clarity are most likely lying"

It's a strong statement, but one that needs a hearing. The point is that we live in a world of much religious exaggeration. In other words, the temptation as a believer is to put on an appearance that we believe with greater certainty than we actually do.

One of the blessings of believing in Jesus is to be relieved of this need to exaggerate. To discover, that our questions and uncertainty, even our doubts, hold a great gift of community and more honest connections with one another. Behind all the hype, is usually another reality, much more human and down to earth. And becoming human and down to earth is exactly how Jesus came to be with you.

Now, we are getting a taste of believing.

St. Paul Lutheran Church Council Minutes for October 18, 2023

"God Sightings" were shared and Pastor Mark offered an opening prayer. The minutes from the previous meeting were reviewed. Correction of Jeanette being present at the September meeting was added. Diane moved to accept the minutes and Jeanette seconded. The minutes were approved as corrected.

Treasurer's Report

Allen Roelfs reported that Diller Telephone Company phone bill was not on report, but got is since the report and was paid. Portico will be on the next month's statement. The furnace has been paid for, \$5,754.60 from current was used, and used \$16,200 from the special fund for the rest. We are still \$6,847.82 ahead in the account. Benevolence is getting close to our commitment. The health plan has been submitted. The copier contract due date needs to be changed to avoid late charges because of when it is due and when the council meeting falls. After all the bills have been paid, the balance in the account is \$6,847.82. Peg moved to accept the report and Brian seconded. Motion passed.

Memorial Treasurer's Report

The account received \$4.52 interest making the balance \$22,745.36. Allen moved to accept the report and Brian seconded. Motion passed.




Mission Work Day


The impromptu choir sang "Blessed Assurance" from the Blue Hymnal during our October 8th Worship service.
