My imperfect offering to the degree it is effective, is sufficient by the Grace of God alone. And what that means is that whatever I think and believe, I will approach it with an appropriate sense of humility.

We live in a world that is being bullied by religious certainty and claims to truth. To be Christ centered is a faith of a different character. The beauty of Christ centeredness is that it is our imperfections and weaknesses that let in the light. And so.......I offer this "Christ centered" article.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Allen reported all bills for the month have been paid. Current balance is \$9,475.94, and we are at half of our goal for Benevolence. Pastor Mark moved to accept the Treasurer's report and Peg seconded. Motion passed.

- ~ Peg brought up that the Ellis Methodist church's Pastor is leaving the church. She wondered about the kids that attend the Ellis church, possibly inviting them to join our church. Pastor Mark told the Council about "Methodism" theology and "Lutheranism" theology, and about how the Missouri Synod of the Lutheran church theology is about "Instructionalism".



VBS 2023 PETS UNLEASHED: WHERE GOD CARES "FUR" YOU!


