



# St. Paul Lutheran Church Council Minutes for October 21, 2020

Members present were Jamie Schultis, Pastor Mark Liscom, Tyler Wolken, David Henrichs, Darin Weers, and Gary Bergmeier. Not present was Melvin Beran. Pastor Mark the meeting by sharing a letter from Bishop Maas regarding current Covid guidelines and recommendations for people attending church. The council shared more life and faith stories with each other. The council reviewed the minutes from September. Jamie moved to accept the minutes and Darin seconded. Minutes were approved.

Treasurer's Report

Gary reported the balance in the account is \$6,723.63. Thrivant, Benevolence, and CROSSWALK bills still need to be paid. After these are to be paid, the ending balance will be approximately \$3,235.95. David moved to accept the treasurer's report and Jamie seconded. Treasurer's report was approved.

Memorial Treasurer's Report

Darin reported that there was \$0.36 of interest, which brought the balance in the account to \$7,104.22. Tyler moved to accept the memorial treasurer's report and Jamie seconded. Memorial treasurer's report was approved.

Pastor's Report

4 worship services, 1 copier installation day, 1 cluster meeting, 1 text study, 2 funeral preps, 1 funeral, 1 premarital session, 1 youth meeting, 6 other calls, 3 confirmation classes, and 3 confirmation make up classes.

- Pastor Mark did purchase a camera for his new computer so that he can participate in Zoom sessions and connect virtually with other congregants and pastors.

- Next week is the Synod convention, which will all be online. Pastor will be meeting with a couple other pastors in Wilbur next week as well.

- Pastor is looking at borrowing a laptop to see if that will help with the connection with the screen connection in the sanctuary.

- Pastor Mark has been updating and adding new material to the church's webpage. Go and check out all the available resources available to you!

Vice Chairman's Report

Jamie wanted to give a thank you to the council for help keeping church services going and stepping into help wherever needed. Jamie also wanted to give a thank you to everyone who has helped with CROSSWALK and making it the success that it is. The team is still looking for volunteers who can help be a body and assist with the kids in sessions. Please reach out if you'd like to help in any way!

**Committee Reports** 

Property- The shingles on the church's roof are start to curl and get worn again in some places. Gary contacted Schoen's Roofing and had them come out and look at the shingles and they confirmed the findings. Schoen's agree to replace the roof. They are sending in a tile sample to check shingle quality. This will not be an expense for St. Paul church. A date for repair has not been set yet, but hopefully before the year end. Gary Bergmeier did spray the church's lawn and Pastor Mark's lawn for weed prevention.

Memorial- Darin spoke with Ed Hajek about combining the two Sunday school rooms and will get an estimate on how much it will cost to take down the dividing wall.

### **Old Business**

- The new copier has been installed.

#### **New Business**

The main topic of discussion was how we move forward with church services. This past few weeks there has been a rise in Covid cases and even some in our community. The council decided to continue to have indoor church services, but <u>masks will be required</u>. If you do not wish to wear a mask, we ask that you sit in a chair in the fellowship area to avoid contact with the congregation members. We are still offering drive-in service with audio only at this time. We still will continue with offering and communion, but will take all the precautions necessary to assure safety for everyone. IF you have any questions or concerns, please contact pastor or one of the council members. We appreciate everyone for sticking with us and still being active members at St. Paul.

Jean Weers continues to recover from a fall injury and is doing well.





There has been talk about renewing the sponsorship program for Confirmation students. Please let Ardie Barber know if you are interested in sponsoring a member of the Confirmation Program.










# **Cross Walk Kids Have Busy October**

Each week an average of 40 students from the preschool – 5<sup>th</sup> grade classes come to enjoy learning, fun and fellowship. An AWESOME crew of young volunteers from 6<sup>th</sup> grade – H.S. lend a valuable hand to make the program work. The sessions start with snacks and play with opening beginning at 4.

The Creation stories were the focus of the CW lessons during the month of October. Through games, music and story the students learned what God created each day. They discovered that Man was created last in God's image and that we are most loved by him. In the 3<sup>rd</sup> story the choice of Adam and Eve led to discussions of our daily choices.





The learning goal for the 2020/21 program is to teach the participants prayer practices and the Lord's Prayer. We are using actions, music, short lessons and practice. It's a joy to see them grow spiritually. Each student also created a Lord's Prayer bookmark craft project to have at home.

Caring projects are also part of the program. The older students made pumpkins from a piece of tree branch painted orange and adorned with a twig stem and green leaves.
