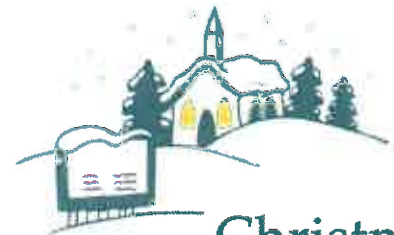

# St. Paul Lutheran Church Council Minutes for November 15, 2017

Pastor Mark opened the meeting with a reading followed by a prayer. Members present were Charles Barber, Marcy Barber, David Henrichs, Cindy Lottman, Allen Roelfs, and Jean Schmidt. Minutes from the October meeting were reviewed. Cindy moved to accept the minutes, and Marcy seconded. Motion passed.

## TREASURER'S REPORT

Marcy reported that the current balance is \$457.25. All bills, except for the hot water heater & video/screen (which have not been received) and the November Portico, have been paid. The weather is getting colder so a propane bill will be coming in soon too. Jean moved to accept, and Allen seconded. Motion passed.

## MEMORIAL TREASURER'S REPORT

Allen reported that the current balance is \$13,373.08. The electrical bill for the church sign has not been received. Chris Schlichtman has donated the labor/concrete work for the new sign. Thank You!! Marcy moved to accept, and Jean seconded. Motion passed.

## PASTOR'S REPORT

4 worship services, 1 Confirmation trip to Mosaic, 1 Confirmation parent's night, 3 Wednesday night Confirmation classes, 1 pancakes/prayer Confirmation, 2 Youth Group meetings, 1 Synod Social Justice meeting, 3 text studies, 8 hospital calls, 4 home communions, 1 baptism and pre-baptism meeting, 1 Theological Conference, 1 worship committee meeting, and 1 Transformational Ministry meeting; no mileage.

- New Confirmation schedule went well this month.
- Pastor Mark would like to schedule a Transformational Committee, including the Mutual Ministry members, meeting with Rich.

President Jane Pretzer opened the business meeting with prayer and members reciting the WELCA Purpose Statement. Minutes of the August 16, 2017 Unit Meeting were read by Secretary Robbyn Roelfs. Treasurer Jeanette Bures reported the current Unit’s balance as \$1,611.59.
