Next Eunice Circle meeting will be August 14, 2017 at 1:30pm, July/August book, August Bible Study. Kay Taylor will be Study Leader.



<u>Day 3</u>: Bible Story: God Is With Gideon Theme: God Is Always With You


Bible Verse: "The Lord your God is with you wherever you go." (Joshua 1:9)

On Sunday, June 11, we concluded our week of Vacation Bible School with a program during the church service. Different activities and songs of each day were shared with our congregation and community.
















