For Freedom Christ has set us free (Galatians 5:1)

For Christ has set us free, not for a political freedom or a freedom of the flesh but for a theological or spiritual freedom. Our conscience is free and joyful, unafraid of the wrath to come (Matthew 3:7) this is the most genuine freedom, it is immeasurable. For who can express what a great gift it is for someone to be able to declare that God neither is nor ever will be wrathful but will forever be a gracious and merciful Father for the sake of Christ?

St. Paul Lutheran Church Council Minutes for February 17, 2026

Council members present were Brian Weers, Doug Schmidt, Jamie Schultis, Allen Roelfs, Pastor Mark Liscom, Scott Pretzer, Charlie Barber and Briana Mahrt on speaker phone. God Sightings were shared and Pastor Mark opened with a prayer. Gary called the meeting to order. Allen moved to approve the minutes with one correction, stated date was 22nd and it is the 21st, was seconded by Charlie. Motion passed.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Allen reported that bills are paid and reconciled, we are down to \$649.31 in cash – account is very tight, but Scott still has a couple deposits to make. We need about \$10,500 in Current each month to meet the budget. We are still in the black and thank the Congregation for its support. Some donations have been received for the concrete project. Allen received a card about Kraft Memorial Grant again, so could apply for that also. Brian moved to accept the Treasurer's Report and it was seconded by Gary. Motion passed.

NEW COMMITTEE COUNCIL REPRESENTATIVES were nominated and elected. Christian Education, Jamie Schultis; Memorial, Charlie Barber; Property, Doug Schmidt; Communication and Outreach, Brian Weers; Music and Worship, Briana Mahrt.

MEMORIAL TREASURER'S REPORT

Thrivent account total as of January 1 is \$29,174.59. Memorial account balance is \$21,297.12. Shadow box will go in to production in March.

Volunteers for the next several months are: February-Jeanette Bures; March-Leatha Christ; April-Julie Schmidt; May-Sherry Henrichs; June-Judy Landenberger; and July-Carolyn Schultis. **Quilters Work Day** – Carolyn reported that several more ladies have joined the group. Quilters Work Day meets on the 4th and 5th Tuesdays of each month from 9 a.m. until noon and any help is always appreciated. **Baby Care Kits** – Marcy and Ardie reported that Lutheran World Relief will only be accepting NEW clothing now. Discussion was held whether to take monetary donations or donations of new clothing for these kits. No decision was made at this time. A folder is located in the fellowship hall with a list of items that are included in the Baby Care Kits and School Kits. **School Kits** – nothing to report. **College Students** – Beth Roelfs volunteered to contact Sheri Schultis and work with her in continuing this project. **Eunice Circle** – meets on the second Monday of each month. Norma Banahan has stepped down as Chairperson of this Circle. We thank Norma for all her many years of dedication and time given in leading this group. Items collected for the annual Coat Drive were delivered to Lincoln People's City Mission after a few items were donated to the Diller-Odell Schools. Thank you to Kendra K. Weers for delivering these items. Thank you to Beth Roelfs for being in charge of the Thank Offering Service. The Thank Offering collected was \$425.62. Our WELCA group provided and served donuts for fellowship hour following the Hanging of the Greens service.

New Business: Ash Wednesday service will be February 18, 2026, with First Communion. WELCA will serve coffee and cookies following the service. 


Our Diller-Odell girls and boys basketball teams had great seasons and fought hard at Districts. We are so proud of all of you and watching your progress through the season!
