#### St. Paul Lutheran Church Council Minutes for January 17, 2024

Council members present were Pastor Mark, Brian Weers, Gary Bergmeier, Peg Hemphill, Allen Roelfs and Diane Wellsandt. Jeanette Bures was absent. Pastor Mark started the meeting with an opening prayer and God Sightings were shared. Brian read the minutes from the previous meeting. Peg moved to accept the minutes and Diane seconded. Motion passed.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT

Allen presented the Treasurer's Report. He reported that December offering was good. Portico bill has not been received yet, need Pastor's vision insurance information. Mission Share has been paid \$8,167, which is over our commitment. Diane moved to accept the Treasurer's Report as presented and Brian seconded. The Treasurer's Report was approved.

#### MEMORIAL TREASURER'S REPORT

The bill for the doors has been paid. Kraft endowment gift of \$6,000 has been received, but is not included in the total balance of the report. Interest of \$4.86 has been received to make a total balance of \$5,677.22, after \$19,083 was paid for the doors.

#### **PASTOR'S REPORT**

Pastor reported 4 worship services, 1 Youth meeting, 1 Christmas Eve service, 1 Confirmation class, 2 rest home visits, 2 Cluster meetings and 1 pre-marital meeting. Pastor was reminded to ask for Synod Assembly delegates.

#### VICE CHAIR'S REPORT

Major projects completed this year are that we have new doors at the entry for the church; replaced the furnace and took unused tables and chairs to the Sudanese Nile Lutheran Church in Omaha. Is trying to think of everyone to thank for all their efforts throughout the year. Allen volunteered to make the ballots for the Annual Meeting.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

Christian Education – meeting canceled due to the weather, next meeting will focus on Adult Education.

Property – Gutters were cleaned, a crack in the corner of the church was grouted, Doug Schmidt tacked tiles to the ceiling, hinges on the Conference Room door have been replaced. Thank you to everyone who helped clear snow Communication & Outreach – N/A

*Music & Worship* – did not meet, but do need to discuss Lent; Holden evening prayer is being discussed *Food Stand* – Allen was able to procure 3 new picnic tables from Exmark

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

Highway 8 sign – we can get a decal for \$40 using the ELCA standard; will do both Hwy 8 and PWF signs. We feel it is just a good reminder to people passing the signs. Odell Bank merger with Heartland Bank is going ok so far, it will not change for statements.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

We are looking into painting the East Sanctuary door and maybe window frames to a darker color. Allen moved to have meals before Lenten services again this year, seconded by Peg. Motion passed. Council will do the first meal on February 21<sup>st</sup>. Ash Wednesday on February 14<sup>th</sup>. Before weekly Lenten services, meal will be at 6pm with services to start at 7pm. We will post a sign-up sheet for the remainder of the Lenten meals. Pastor may do Lenten series on Lutheran Doctrine and Theology as he has been doing in Confirmation and use Holden prayer for liturgy.

The next council meeting was set for February 19 at 7 p.m., committees to meet at 6:30 p.m. Allen moved to adjourn the meeting and Diane seconded. The meeting was adjourned and closed with the Lord's Prayer.

#### Minutes for the Annual Meeting of St. Paul Lutheran Church, ELCA, January 21, 2024

The 2024 Annual Meeting was called to order and opened by Council Chair Gary Bergmeier. It was requested that all sign the register for those present for voting. There were 32 congregational members present. Pastor Mark Liscom offered an opening prayer. The minutes from the 2023 annual meeting were read with one correction; Marcy Barber, not Ardie Barber, was one of the auditors for 2023. Allen Roelfs moved to approve the minutes as corrected and Joely Weers seconded. The minutes were approved as corrected.

#### NOMINATING COMMITTEE AND BALLOT REPORT

- Darin presented the ballot in the Committee report. He thanked those willing to come forward, and stated that it was nice to see some younger members involved with the church business.
- Gary asked for nominations for Council from the floor, none brought forward. Ballots were distributed. Gary asked for Nominating Committee nominations from the floor, none received.
- Allen asked for volunteers for ballot count. Counters were Kendra K Weers, Beth Roelfs and Marcy Barber.
- Ballots were handed out and votes collected for Council, Nominating Committee and Food Stand. Voting results listed below.

#### AUDITOR'S REPORT

Committee members Charlie Barber, Holli Pretzer and Jarrod Heidemann reported all books to be in order.

#### **BUDGET DISCUSSION**

Allen Roelfs presented the recommended Budget and thanked everyone for their support. He stated that he is proud of this congregation. The biggest change to the budget is really the property insurance. Pastor's benefits are down because of Medicare, utilities are a little high, total budget is up \$6,800 with Pastor's salary increased 3%. There are other minor changes. Total needed in current per month is \$10,325.39 to meet this budget. Ballots for the budget were distributed and votes collected. No other discussion about the budget..

While ballots were being counted for the Budget, Gary announced the results of the election (see below).

#### PASTOR'S REPORT

Pastor talked about being at ease – how the year started out very stressful and took almost all of his time just to keep up. Then, when the second half of the year started, everything calmed down and basically fell into a routine – a routine with an ease to it. The past few years were difficult and stressful personally, and the ease he was now experiencing was somewhat unfamiliar. The current world and culture tries to keep everyone on edge and "uneasy"; divided, manipulated, angry and feeling used – reminding us that "at ease" doesn't mean "easy" – but does mean that if someone "lights a match", we don't have to be the kindling to start the fire. "When you are at ease, it's easier to think, solve problems, be creative, and be with people in a difficult circumstance. It is harder to say things that you might later regret." God will guard our hearts and minds. He then discussed the Lenten series based on the five chapters of Dietrich Bonhoeffer's book "Life Together" and what it means to live together as a Christian Community. This year was not a "round robin" series, so Pastor could focus on the message of the book. He reported on the happenings in CrossWalk, Confirmation and the Youth Group, and discussed the "Adult Forum Lite", which is a type of Adult Education where discussion was held after worship about the sermon and the different perspectives from people. He then thanked the many people and groups that make this church work and the ministries they are a part of, and that he is thankful to the congregation for its support.

Retiring Council members Peg and Diane were recognized. Gary also recognized all who do the many jobs around the church. Gary also thanked Pastor Mark for what he has done this past year, and noted major projects completed this year with the automated front door and furnace replacement projects.

#### **UNFINISHED BUSINESS**


- Brian thanked the Memorial Committee and donors of the Memorial Fund for their patience in implementing projects for the funds and the major benefits these memorials provide for the church.
- Kendra K talked about the Newscaster and sponsorships for 2024 are almost filled. Also noted was that Sponsorships for 2025 will increase to \$40 per sponsorship (two sponsors per issue) due to the rapid rise in postage costs and that current sponsorship levels do not cover the amount of postage per issue. Kendra also thanked the many contributors, reporters and those who provide photos for the Newscaster and those who submit articles for their efforts and cooperation in the production of the Newscaster.

#### **CONCLUSION OF MEETING**

Pastor Mark offered prayers in memory of those that have passed in 2023 – Rick Whittemire, Franklin Damrow, Dave Lottman, Jean Schmidt, Russell Schultis and Isaiah Weers. Pastor thanked Gary for serving as Council Chair this past year.

Beth Roelfs moved to adjourn the meeting and was seconded by Joely Weers. Motion passed and meeting was adjourned.
