God Knocking At Your Door

"Listen! I am standing at the door, knocking; if you hear my voice and open the door, I will come in to you and eat with you, and you with me" (Rev. 3:20)

As I am writing this, it's hard to know what the reality of our lives will be by the time this newscaster reaches you. My guess is that the corona virus epidemic will be impacting us more than it is at the time of my writing this. From all the information I've been able to glean that seems to be the prediction.

So where is God in all of this? I think in at least a couple of simple ways. The first is that you may realize that you are being nudged to reach out and care for others. To become less preoccupied with yourself and more concerned about our neighbor. It's God, knocking at your door breathing new life.

But I think another way may be just as important. By the time you read this, you may be experiencing a kind of emptiness. Maybe there are financial losses, a down turn in your business. But as a result of our need to isolate and all of these radical changes, you may experience the "blues" settling in.

Where is God in this? During this unprecedented time I would like you to consider this, if it happens to you. I would like you to consider that this may be God's Holy Spirit knocking on your door, asking for entrance. God likes to come in disguises you know!

This empty place in us is usually covered up by all the noise and speed of our modern world. And we don't always experience it. But if these "blues" come to you during this crazy time, I'd like you to be open to this possibility. Sure, get outside if you can, call a friend; take care of your health. But also be open to this: that God's Spirit is carving a place in your own soul. A place for you to connect to the One who said he came to "prepare a place for you" (John 14:3).

God is at work encouraging us to love and care for our neighbor to be sure. But for some of us, God is knocking on our door waiting to be welcomed; and working on creating an empty place in us, so that we can. Can you hear it? God is knocking at your door, waiting to bring you new life.

St. Paul Lutheran Church Council Minutes for March 17, 2020

The meeting was opened with Pastor Mark reading a letter from the Bishop addressing the Covid-19 issue and how we still need to practice safe distancing and continue praying for all things. Members present were David Henrichs, Jamie Schultis, Darin Weers, Gary Bergmeier, Pastor Mark Liscom, and Tyler Wolken (Not present Melvin Beran). The minutes from February were reviewed. David moved to accept the minutes and Darin seconded. Minutes were approved.

Treasurer's Report

Gary reported that the balance in the account was \$21,876. Still needing to be paid are Portico, Solution One, and Norris. There are still funds in the account to reimburse Schoen's for the shingle repair. Thus, leaving approximately \$9000-\$10,000 left in the account. For a more detailed balance, please check the submitted Treasurer's report below in the newsletter. David moved to accept the Treasurer's report and Jamie seconded. Treasurer's report approved.

Memorial Treasurer's Report

Darin reported that there was a balance of \$8,332.62 and had an interest of \$1.28. Gary moved to accept the Memorial Treasurer's report and David seconded. Memorial Treasurer's Report approved.

Pastor's Report

2 funerals, 2 youth meetings, 2 confirmation classes, 1 confirmation make-up, 3 worship services, 3 cluster meetings, 1 Ash Wednesday service, 1 Lenten service, 3 home visits, 1 week of vacation, 1 Cat in the hat event at the school, 1 prepared sermon for Jamie to give at Wednesday Lent service, Gave the message at World day of prayer, and stayed home for 4 days after fever symptoms.

Vice Chair Report

Jamie led the Wednesday Lent service and gave the sermon that Pastor Mark had prepared due to illness. Jamie wanted to extend a big thank you to everyone who has helped set up and serve meals at the two funerals this past months. Jamie also wanted to thank the council and the women of the E.L.C.A. for their work in serving and providing the Wednesday Lent meals.

Committee Reports

Memorial- Darin reported that the new lights for the church are due to arrive around March 27th.

Property- Gary reported that Ed Hajek was the only one that gave a bid on the remodeling project for the church. Diller Electric has agreed to help with the rewiring part of this remodel. We will table the project until we have got all bids in and council has agreed on construction details.

Christian Education- Crosswalk had been postponed due to Covid-19 outbreak and with school closing. Looking to have alternative ways to still to reach out to the youth.

Old Business


- Council decided to postpone the church insurance audit (TBD). Jamie moved to postpone. David seconded the motion. Motion

- Since we are no longer able to have in-person sermons, we are looking at having alternative options for the congregation to be able to participate in church worship. Looking to have services via Facebook, Youtube, or possibly a link to the church's website. Look for details to come out very soon! The church's Facebook will have the latest updates. - Due to the Covid-19 virus, we suspending all in person gatherings at St. Paul at least until Easter. We are restricted to gatherings to 10 people or less. We are <u>not</u> allowing any outside gatherings/non-church group meetings at St. Paul a this time until further notice.
- Women's Bible study has been canceled until further notice.

Next month we will have two workdays, March 24 and 31.



Remembering Dietrich Bonhoeffer

The Christian church commemorates Dietrich Bonhoeffer — pastor, theologian, anti-Nazi spy — on April 9, the anniversary of his 1945 martyrdom. Among his much-loved writings are nuggets of wisdom such as these:

"Judging others makes us blind, whereas love is illuminating. By judging others we blind ourselves to our own evil and to the grace which others are just as entitled to as we are." (The Cost of Discipleship)

"In normal life we hardly realize how much more we receive than we give, and life cannot be rich without such gratitude. It is so easy to overestimate the importance of our own achievements compared with what we owe to the help of others." (Letters and Papers from Prison)

"The table fellowship of Christians implies obligation. It is our daily bread that we eat, not my own. We share our bread. Thus we are firmly bound to one another not only in the Spirit but in our whole physical being. The one bread that is given to our fellowship links us together in a firm covenant."
