## **Knowing God's Will**

One of the more fascinating aspects of the spiritual life is this whole business of "God's will" and knowing God's will. People have a real desire to know God's will, and if you claim to "Know how to know" God's will, you will probably have a pretty good crowd that night.

There are a few problems however, with this whole business of "knowing God's will". The main problem is that people usually want God to simply tell them what to do. I know I've prayed that prayer many times. God just tell me what it is your will for me to do.

It would be nice if the spiritual life worked that way. But it really doesn't. And the reason is that wanting God to "tell you what to do" is usually a way of avoiding the hard decisions and difficult choices that life brings to us. After all, if you can say, "God told me", you're off the hook!

Or consider this: What if you were a parent and your child came to you all the time asking to be told what to do? You would eventually realize that your child needed to get out on their own and try some things, make a few mistakes maybe, in order to learn how to become a strong and confident person.

I think we can come to know God's will over time. But it's not God's will for us to be robots. I think we can say that it is God's will that we become strong and confident. People who can take risks and be creative because we are assured that no matter what happens, we are safe in his Grace.

So often, when we ask God to tell us tell us his will, the answer I think is simply this: What's **your** will? What do **you** want? Now we're getting somewhere in the spiritual life.

### St. Paul Lutheran Church Council Minutes for February 17, 2019

Members present were returning members, Pastor Mark, Allen Roelfs, Melvin Beran, Jamie Schultis, Cindy Lottman, Dave Henrichs, and Jean Schmidt and new members Darin Weers and Tyler Wolken.

Pastor opened the meeting with a prayer. Jamie Schultis made a motion to approve the minutes and Allen Roelfs seconded. Motion passed.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT

Allen Roelfs reported that the balance is \$13,755.19. Allen mentioned that the church is doing quite well and that the church is receiving much needed and generous donations for the congregation. Portico has been paid as well as Pastor Mark's salary. All bills will be paid by the end of the end of the month, which include Norris and Solution One. Cindy Lottman moved to accept and seconded by Jean Schmidt. Motion passed.

### **MEMORIAL TREASURER'S REPORT**

Jamie Schultis reported that the current balance of the account is \$13,321.90. As of lately, there has been no new activity. Allen Roelfs moved to approve and Melvin Beran seconded. Motion passed.

### PASTOR'S REPORT

- No mileage was reported due to late meeting notice. (Mileage will be reported to council as soon as possible)
- Pastor reported on his retreat to Arizona. Pastor Mark briefly discussed his time at the retreat. He shared some of highs and lows
  of the trip with the council. Since the meeting was scheduled shortly after Pastor's return, a more detailed summary will be talked
  about at next meeting.
- Allen Roelfs moved to approve the report and Jamie Schultis seconded. Motion passed.

### **OLD BUSINESS**

- Council had been researching and discussing who would help lead the church's vision team. The council decided upon Sonnie
  Richarson. Sonnie was the former program director at Camp Carol Joy Holling. Sonnie is now the Deacon/Director of
  Discipleship at First Lutheran Church in Lincoln. She will be the chairman of the vision team and help oversee and provide
  guidance and support for the team. The council will contact Sonnie to set up a meeting time that will work for her and the vision
  team.
- The transformational committee went back to Lincoln (January 26). The committee decided to attend the Step 1 session again as they felt it could help them in gaining a better outlook on the steps needed to develop the vision team and other congregational aspects. Allen made the point that there may be a need to reseat and reorganize the committee. It was discussed that the name of the program may need to be changed to something other than "Transformational". This committee will be revised and revisited at the next meeting.
- Council continued discuss the pros and cons of moving accounts from the current bank in Fairbury to the State Bank of Odell.
   Discussion at the meeting was positive. Allen Roelfs moved to table the discussion until next month and Melvin Beran seconded the motion. Motion passed.

- Council approved having meals before the Lenten services again this year. Council will make and set out a sign-up sheet for all congregational groups to sign up with the day they prefer to host. Church Council decided to host the first Lenten service, which will be March 13, 2019 at 6:30pm followed by the service. The council divided its tasks amongst the group.
- Cindy Lottman asked for a volunteer to be a backup for Kendra Weers for collecting the offering. Melvin Beran volunteered.

The next council meeting was set for Tuesday, March 19, at 6pm. The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer. Darin Weers made the motion to adjourn and Allen seconded. Motion passed.




# Mission Work Day



### GUEST PASTOR DR. ROBERT RADEMACHER



### What's your theme?


Disgusted by a tasteless dish, Winston Churchill once summoned a waiter, saying, "Take this pudding away. It has no theme!"
