## **Should We Forget 2020?**

Something that has interested me in listening to people talk about this last "covid" year is this idea that we should just forget it. Sort of pretend it didn't happen. 2020 is a kind of throw away, a sort of odd blip on the stat sheet, that shouldn't really count for anything. Let's move on. If yesterday was bad, just let it go and focus on a better tomorrow.

I certainly understand the sentiment and have said it myself. But I would caution you to not just "forget" 2020 or pretend it didn't happen, especially during this Christmas and New Year season. From a biblical perspective this is why. Just about all of the events that we now understand to be filled with God's presence in the Scripture were at the time as uncomfortable and crazy as 2020 has ever been.

What if we were to "just forget" the difficult and crazy events that surrounded Jesus birth? That he was born in a stable, that his parents became refugees in another country? Just about every detail of the Christmas story created fear and uncertainty in those who experienced it. And yet hidden in all these crazy and unsettling details, God was being born in our world!

But it's not just the Christmas story. It's the whole story of Jesus. Isn't that the message of the cross? That in what looked like something to forget as soon as possible God was actually present in the most amazing way possible? That hidden in the negative, was the greatest positive?

Like you I'm looking forward to a little better 2021. No problem. But let's not just "forget" 2020. For hidden in these uncomfortable circumstances, God just may have been present in a way we should never forget.

Members present were Pastor Mark Liscom, Jamie Schultis, Gary Bergmeier, Darin Weers, David Henrichs, and Tyler Wolken. Not present was Melvin Beran. Pastor Mark began the meeting by everyone sharing life and faith stories. The council reviewed the minutes from November's meeting. Jamie moved to accept the minutes and Gary seconded. Minutes were approved.

#### Treasurer's Report

Gary reported that the balance in the account was \$5,020.34. This is after Norris, Solution One, and Portico are paid. David moved to accept the report and Darin seconded. The treasurer's report was approved.

#### Memorial Treasurer's Report

Darin reported that the account had \$0.42 in interest. Brining the balance to \$7,105.03. Jamie moved to accept the report and Tyler seconded. The memorial treasurer's report was passed.

#### Pastor's Report

1 youth meeting, 3 confirmation classes, 3 confirmation make up classes, 2 text studies, installed the FM transmitter, 1 cluster meeting, 1 Thanksgiving service, 4 worship services (2 online), and 10 days of quarantine.

#### Vice Chairman's Report

Jamie wanted to send out a thank you to the entire congregation that has showed up and been so supportive during this time of Covid. We appreciate everyone that has come and followed the guidelines.

#### **Committee Reports**

**Christian Education-** The committee has been working on putting together a virtual Christmas program to be showed during the service. The program can be viewed on the church's Facebook page as well.

#### EBELING FAMILY HELPS OTHERS ONE TAB AT A TIME

Your aluminum can tabs go a long way with Ronald McDonald House Charities in Omaha.

Lily Ebeling and her family donated 23 pounds of aluminum can tabs to support the Ronald McDonald House of Omaha. This would be about 34, 500 tabs WOW! Way to go Ebeling family. Everyone is encouraged to support this cause. A collection container sits near the door in the fellowship area.

These tabs, when recycled, help cover some of the operational costs at the house. Thanks to schools, business, community organizations, and families, the Omaha home recycled approximately 35 million pop tabs last year, and the money from those donations paid for their electric bill each month.



Why pop tabs and not the entire can? Because pop tabs are smaller and easier to store. The tabs are also paint free and pure aluminum, which increases their value and profit when recycled. So pull your tabs for the Ronald McDonald House, but be sure to recycle the cans.

Here are some fun facts about tabs:

One pound of tabs is about 1,500 tabs.

• Each tab measures about 1 inch, so there are 12 tabs in one foot.

To reach a mile, when placing tabs end to end, would take 63,360 tabs.

1 million tabs end to end would stretch 16.75 miles.
















Youth will have a meeting the evening of January 14 at the church and the evening of January 31, time and location TBA.

## Elementary December 10




