## From Cynicism to Hope

I talked with a person the other day who has given up on watching the news. "It's all one sided" was the comment. I've talked with other people who have given up on politics, or at least any notion that something good can come from it. Who can you believe these days? It's easy to throw in the towel.

I get it. But still, we have to recognize this "giving up" for what it is. It is the victory of the "cynic" within ourselves. And what we are actually doing, when we "give up" this way, is spreading hopelessness. It's all a bunch of <u>(fill in the blank)</u>. That's hopelessness isn't it?

Cynicism is difficult to resist. Because it makes you feel righteous and smart to "give up" on things. It looks like a position of superiority. You feel that good feeling of being certain and right. That's why cynicism is so popular. It makes you feel strong.

But cynicism must be resisted at all levels, we must be a people of hope instead! And that happens in a very simple way. When it all seems to be such a mess, when we've lost our trust, the way to move from cynicism to hope, is not to just throw in the towel, but to do this: Experience the pain of it.

Listen: Jesus brought hope to the world how? By experiencing the pain of the world's mess on the cross. The way of cross is the way to move from cynicism to hope. In Romans 5 Paul writes: "and not only that, we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us."

We live in difficult times. Don't throw in the towel but experience the pain of it. Don't judge it, just experience it. Share it with someone you love. Man, this really hurts. It won't be long until you realize that you are not alone, that many are with you, and you discover the power of a love that surrounds you. It's not hopeless after all! You are following in the footstep of Jesus....who never gives up on us.



More meetings and activities are planned, following the guidelines to keep everyone healthy. Check out the church website for updates to any scheduled activity or meeting.








