### NEW BUSINESS

Pastor would like to take a Pastor's Class at Camp Carol Joy Holling, "How Then Shall I Lead". It is 4 classes that takes place in March, April and May, at a cost of \$500.

Lent is coming soon, and the series will return to a "round robin" format. There will be a meal before every Lenten service starting at 6pm with services starting at 7pm. The Council will provide for the first meal on March 9<sup>th</sup>. There will be a sign-up sheet in the Narthex for the other Lenten services meals.

Synod Convention will take place on June 2<sup>nd</sup> through 4<sup>th</sup> at the Younes Conference Center at Kearney. Beth Roelfs has indicated that she would like to go to the Convention as one of our representatives. The Nebraska Synod Bishop Maas is resigning in August, so a new Bishop will be elected at this Convention. Our Cluster has put forth some names for nomination for the new Bishop.

Diane will be gone for the last Sunday in February, so someone needs to check the church after CrossWalk on Wednesday and before Worship on Sunday. Jeanette expressed interest in filling this need.

Gary asked about putting funerals and wedding services on our Facebook page. Pastor has already been asking people if they would like to broadcast their services on our page.

Discussion was held about the Eternal Candle soot on the front wall. Dave suggested we remove the stand and have the candle moved out from the wall and hung by a chain like is done at other churches. The cost could be covered by a memorial gift.

The next council meeting was set for Thursday, March 17<sup>th</sup> at 7:00pm and committees to meet at 6:30pm. Gary moved to adjourn the meeting and Peg seconded. The meeting was adjourned and closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Old Business: Work Day – January 25<sup>th</sup>.

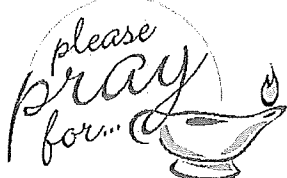
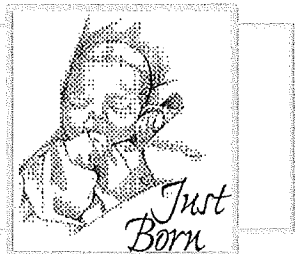

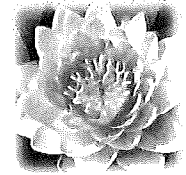

# St. Paul Women of the ELCA Unit Meeting

February 1, 2022

A Unit Meeting of the Women of the ELCA was held Tuesday, February 1, 2022, at 1:30 p. m. with ten women and Pastor Mark present. The meeting was opened by reading Our Purpose Statement in unison.

The business meeting was led by President, Ardith Barber. Secretary, Peggy Hemphill read the minutes of the November 3, 2021 meeting. A motion to approve the minutes was made by Beth Roelfs and seconded by Jane Pretzer. Minutes were approved. The Treasurer's report was given by Diane Wellsandt. It was reported that the balance in our treasury is \$940.93. Peggy Hemphill made a motion to approve the Treasurer's report and it was seconded by Linda Behrends. The report was approved. There were no outstanding bills to be paid.

Correspondence: A thank-you was read from Lutheran World Relief for the \$200 that we had sent for shipping of the quilts and school and baby care kits. A thank-you was read from Samantha Clifford for the college care kit she received and Ardith Barber mentioned that she had received some verbal thank-you's from some of the other college students. A thank-you was also read from the family of Cleo Perkins in appreciation for serving Cleo's funeral luncheon. We also received a thank-you from Ruby Hardin on behalf of the Southeast Nebraska Area (Wymore) food pantry for our monetary donation given to them.

It was reported that all of the long brown tables have now been sold. We are still trying to sell the small Sunday School tables and chairs.

The Food Drive this past fall was again successful. We collected 294 items that were taken to the Blue Valley Food Pantry in Fairbury. We also received \$900 in donations which were split \$400 to Blue Valley and \$500 was given to Southern Gage Food Pantry in Wymore. A motion was made by Beth Roelfs and seconded by Diane Wellsandt to continue with this annual food drive for Blue Valley, Wymore and St. John food pantries. Motion carried.

Our women's Thank Offering Service was held Sunday, November 21. Offering collected was \$190.

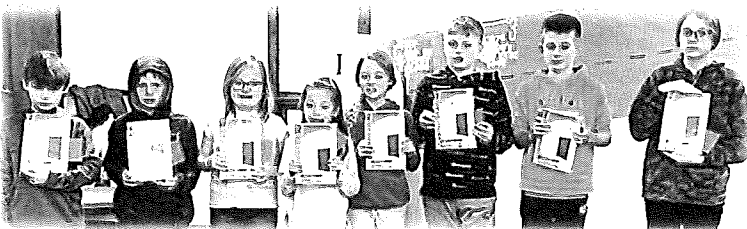

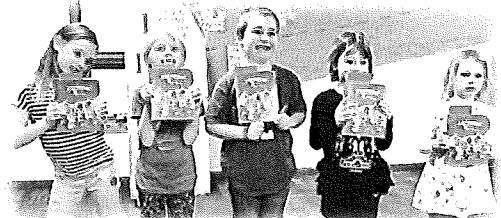

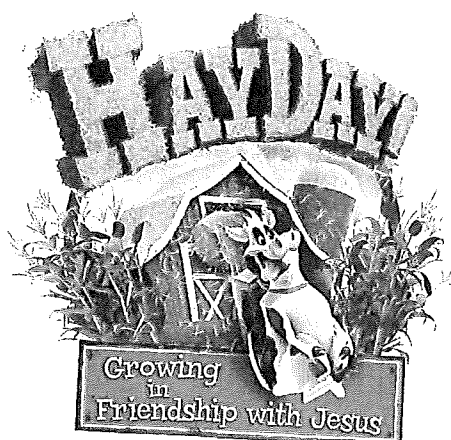
