The ways to experiment are endless, but during this season of Lent, maybe we could experiment with prayer. I've been pushing solitude and silence......why not experiment with it? Ask God for advice on something you need help with. I'd like to experiment with a healing service maybe. Just "play around" and see what happens.

Could it be that a core desire of God is that we experiment with our relationship? That by together "trying this and that" we come into God's presence? Hmmmm.


