Where We Are With COVID-19

As we continue to live through this pandemic, perhaps it is important once in a while to gain at least a little clarity on how we are currently approaching this as a congregation.

When the pandemic first hit, we basically closed the church building and moved outside, shutting down almost anything that was in the building. As fall came however, we began to "open up" somewhat. Our kids went back to school, and we brought worship back into the building with masks, social distancing and Facebook Live. Communion, Confirmation, Youth group, and Crosswalk went back to a "sort of" normal.

Where are we now? The consensus seems to be that it's time to a get little more fully back to normal. What that means practically is (with masks and some effort at social distancing) that we will go back to our full worship service, get worship assistants and acolytes again, and all of our committees meeting again. Certain large group gatherings like the Sweeheart supper won't work. A normal Coffee hour after church isn't in the picture yet. But it's time it seems for our basic structure to get back to a more normal state. A "new normal" maybe.

Thanks to everyone for their flexibility and creativity during this time as we continue to walk through this pandemic together.

Members present were Jamie Schultis, Pastor Mark Liscom, Tyler Wolken, David Henrichs, Gary Bergmeier, and Darin Weers. Not present was Melvin Beran. Pastor Mark opened the meeting by opening it up for everyone to share life and faith stories. The minutes from December were reviewed. Daivd moved to accept the minutes and Jamie seconded. The minutes were approved.

Treasurer's Report

The current balance in the account is \$558.22. Still needing to be paid are Norris and Protico. As well as World Hunger and our Benevolence donations. After these are to be paid it would leave a balance of (-\$3,214.46). Darin moved to accept the treasure's report and Jamie seconded. The treasurer's report was approved.

Memorial Treasurer's Report

Darin reported that the account had an interest of \$0.42. The new balance is \$7,105.45. The Thrivent account had 4th quarter gain of \$1,937.07. 2020 had a total gain of \$2,762.38. Balance in the account stands at \$23,554.22

David moved to accept the Memorial treasurer's report and Gary seconded. The report was approved.

Pastor's Report

2 confirmation classes, 1 confirmation make up day, 1 youth meeting, 4 worship services, 1 Christmas Eve service, 1 cluster meeting, 1 text study, 3 hospital call, 7 other calls.

Pastor has reached out to several congregation members throughout the month. Pastor has been working on the Lent services. He is looking into the topic of, if God is all powerful, why is there so much suffering? He will diving into the odicy of it all and what it means. Pastor Mark has been communicating with the new confirmation families and is trying to get them on board with acolyte duties and 1st communion.

Vice Chairman Report

Jamie wanted to send a thank you to everyone who participated and put on the Christmas program that made it a great success. Lastly, he wanted to send a thank you to all the Crosswalk volunteers for keeping the program growing and thriving.

Committee Reports

Property- Darin spoke with Ed Hajek about the construction project of the two Sunday school rooms and has received approval from the memorial donors to proceed with the renovation project. Doug Schmidt has also installed a couple carbon monoxide detectors throughout the church. We appreciate his help in keeping the church safe and up-to-date.

Nominating- The committee was able to find two members who volunteered to be on council in place of Jamie and Melvin. Those two are Diane Wellsandt and Peggy Hemphill. There are also two nominations from the floor. Those two are Dennis Nippert and Scott Pretzer. At the annual meeting, nominations from the floor can accept the nomination or decline. Once nominations are finalized, members will vote for two people to service on council for a three year term.

- The auditing committee reviewed the accounts and made their suggestions and corrections.
- After reviewing the budget 2020 budget and making a prediction for 2021, Darin made the motion to decrease the annual benevolence donation from \$9000 to \$7000. Gary seconded the motion. 4-Yes 1-No (David H.) The motion passed.
- The council reviewed the ballot and made corrections to the council member ballot. All other items on the ballots stayed the same. Items that will be voted on will be whether to have a Diller Picnic food stand, how to distribute the funds afterwards, and 2021 budget approval.
- The council is encouraging everyone that is willing and able to attend the meeting. Pastor and council will take all the precautions necessary to make sure everyone is safe and social distanced. IF you don't feel comfortable sitting in the pews, we can arrange chairs in the fellowship area to keep your distance. Masks are still required. If you have questions or concerns, please contact Pastor Mark or any other council member for assistance.

 - The annual meeting will be held January 31st right after the service is complete.

After Grace, Cleo Perkins served refreshments.





CrossWalk Christian Education

The learning focus for Crosswalk this year is to help the children learn about prayer practices and the Lord's Prayer. The first session in January was all about prayer. Each child created their own prayer bead necklace or bracelet to help guide them in their prayers to God.

Red: Pray for teacher at school

Yellow: Pray for someone in your family

Blue: Pray for a friend

Green: Pray for a neighbor

Orange: Pray for yourself

Purple: Pray for someone at Crosswalk

Brown: Pray for someone in another country

The kid's also watched a video about the Lord's Prayer and it's meaning as well as playing games that helped to practice the words to the Lord's Prayer. The following week they were introduced to the 5 finger prayer.

Other lesson themes were: Following God and standing up for your faith even when it is hard and What does Holy mean. Students learned why the church is a holy place. They designed their own churches and toured the sanctuary where they learned about the baptismal font, alter, and got to stand in the pulpit. The stained glass windows and the statue of Jesus received a lot of the kids attention.


UPCOMING FOR YOUTH AND CONFIRMATION
