#### **Teaching the Faith**

"I discovered later, and am still discovering right up to this moment, that it is only by living completely in this world that one learns to have faith. By this-worldliness I mean living unreservedly in life's duties, problems, successes, failures. In so doing we throw ourselves completely into the arm of God, taking seriously not our own suffering but those of God in the world. That, I think, is faith".

~Dietrich Bonhoeffer

What does it mean to teach the faith? My guess is that if I asked you that question you might say learning the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the 10 Commandments. Perhaps something that had to do with church might be the response. You would enter a kind of religious world.

Dietrich Bonhoeffer is probably the most famous Lutheran theologian of the last century. And he answered the question much differently. One learns to have faith, he said, by living real life and taking in as much of reality of this world as possible.

The reality of this world is overwhelming. The massive wealth, the massive poverty, the overwhelming achievements, and the overwhelming failures. Most people are seeking some way to escape from it all.

Bonhoeffer said that the curriculum for faith was "in" it all. Life as we actually have it. Why? Because that's where God is to be found. God can show up at church, but he shows up in every circumstance, and especially where there is suffering.

It's a different way to think about learning the faith isn't it? It's really just learning to see reality. Because that's where God is. Pretty cool way to think about it.



After Grace, Marla Weichel served refreshments.



Thanks also to EVERYONE who donated snack items or money to purchase food and drinks. We look forward to starting another great year in September.




