Don't Talk Religion or Politics

I remember growing up that this was a kind of rule that was used to govern polite conversation. Don't talk religion or politics. It was a kind of an agreement that was made on a cultural level to sort of keep a lid on what could lead to a very destructive evening. And even now it is a rule that often governs our churches. Don't talk politics. Often there isn't much talk about religion either!

But I have to say, this was a very destructive way of thinking. If the road to hell is paved with good intentions, this was surely an example of what that means. For the truth is, that what you cannot talk about, what you cannot bring to speech begins to grow and dominate your way of life. If you cannot talk about a drinking problem, that problem will take over your life. And no where as we begin this New Year do we see this happening more than in religion and politics in our culture. That destruction that we sought to avoid by keeping a lid on it, has now taken over what it means to live our lives in 2024.

As we face a New Year, I have to say that talking about religion and politics is core to the spiritual life. It's a critical dimension of what it means to "take up our cross". The Good News is that all of our views are imperfect and inadequate, often self-serving. And so political discussions are a Great way to experience the power of the Spirit. Learning to humble ourselves at the very least. And there is nothing that is more needed in our discussions of religion and politics than that humility.

So let's get rid of that old bad rule. We need to talk about religion and politics. And learn how to do it in a way that is faithful and characterized by humility. Destructive conversation is taking over. We have a way to begin to heal it. Let's take this power into our New Year.



First Communion was given to two new Confirmation students, being the first Sunday of the month.


































Youth joined the congregation in caroling. We split into two groups starting out of town and went to many homes in the Diller and Steele City areas and many places in-between.


WHO WAS IN THE STABLE ON CHRISTMAS NIGHT?


