And in this mode of thinking we tend to say things like, "why can't we all get along?" All of the conflict that goes on around us is simply wearisome and discouraging. We're tired of the news and the constant strife.

On the other hand, it seems that we're fascinated by conflict. Recently I listened to a podcast about what is happening in NASCAR auto racing. And one of the things they are trying to do is create more conflict among the drivers. Conflict creates interest, it seems that without conflict, a sport or politics just gets boring. In this mode of thinking we're hungry for conflict. There's nothing like a good fight to spice up the ratings!

What's up with this, anyway? Why do we want to avoid conflict and yet are drawn to it?

Well, I think the reason may be that we're wired for connection and love. For each other and to God. And the truth is, that conflict is a big part of that connection. There's no real love without conflict. That's why I think that we can be afraid of conflict and yet at the same time be fascinated by it. We know the risks and the rewards that are possible.

One meaning of the cross of Jesus, is that conflict can be transformed into a new beginning. It's true, that we look around and often see nothing in conflict but destruction. But with the eyes of faith, we can begin to approach conflict in a different way. As a pathway not to destruction, but deeper connection.

The minutes from the previous meeting were reviewed. Allen moved to accept the minutes and Diane seconded. The minutes were approved.

Treasurer's Report

Allen Roelfs reported that all the bills have been paid, but don't have the bill for the new furnace yet. We have around \$16,200 now to go toward it. We will decide later just how to pay the balance. Brian moved to accept the report and Jeanette seconded. Motion passed.

Memorial Treasurer's Report

The account received \$4.50 interest making the balance \$22,740.84. Peg moved to accept the report and Allen seconded. Motion passed.

2 worship services, 2 text studies, 2 Confirmation classes, 1 Youth meeting, 1 active remote meeting, 4 home communions, 1 funeral meeting, 1 pre-marital meeting.

BVCA sent a thank-you letter for donations received. The women have a new funeral policy.

- Ardun Dorn, on October 21st and 22nd, will present a Building Leaders Conference on what it means to serve in the church focusing on younger members, and Pastor Mark would like to have someone from our congregation attend the conference.
- Pastor wants to have Confirmation students have a "church day" to try to get them to church on a Sunday, will see if it works.
- We may try some new ideas about Children's Sermon, may call it something different.




Kids also got to fill backpacks for youth in other countries. A project our church has done for many years. Thank you Irene Gibson for always helping coordinate this project.

THANK YOU to all who donated and made a real difference in the lives of the many animals cared for by the Humane Society!




YOUTH GROUP HAS FUN OUTING


