Forgiveness (A Personal Story)

I rarely talk about forgiveness. The main reason is that the word just doesn't seem to carry much weight for me. It's all a part of the jargon that religious language often becomes, and as a result, an obstacle to God. We did some bad things this week and God forgives us. Ho Hum. The jargon doesn't take sin seriously, so the antidote doesn't seem that serious either.

Nevertheless, forgiveness can be everything. Here's a short personal story about forgiveness.

My mom passed away a few weeks ago, and I was (if you can believe it) sitting at church during her funeral. The story part of it is that many people, including the presiding pastor, asked me if I wanted to do the service. But I couldn't have done it. I honestly didn't know what to say. I really just wanted to sit and listen this time.

But then as I sat there, it came to me. Forgiveness. Nothing else needed to be said, and there was nothing that was more real. I didn't ask for it, or look for it. I couldn't have predicted it. It just showed up when I just decided to listen. Forgiveness. And nothing more was needed.

I don't know if I will say much about forgiveness in the future. Back to work, the word still doesn't carry much weight. But for the record, here it is. Forgiveness is everything.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Briana presented the report. Food Stand did reasonably well, \$2,467.50 gross and \$899.48 net received. Unsold meat could still be sold. General fund is still tight. It was moved by Brian and seconded by Charlie to approve the report. Motion approved.

MEMORIAL TREASURER'S REPORT

Balance of \$8,067.12 and a Thrivent account balance of \$31,084.18 was reported.

PASTOR'S REPORT

4 Worship services, 1 funeral, 4 communions, 2 pre-marital sessions, 3 text studies and 1 Cluster meeting.

VICE CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Scott discussed feedback to Pastor's Summer immigration series, we have encouraged Pastor to try new things and we would like to know how its being received. Scott will address congregation. Still discussing park campers issue and outreach to them.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Communication & Outreach – committee met last night. Scott reported Confirmation Kickoff on September 9 with hamburgers and hot dogs. Will have outreach materials available. CrossWalk kickoff on September 16th with cookies and ice cream. Pastor Mark would like some congregational members to come along to give communion to shut-ins. Scott will bring it up to congregation on Sunday.

Memorial – Included in Memorial Treasurer's Report.

Music & Worship – Briana may bring up Service in the Park with committee.

Christian Education – met a couple weeks ago to finalize VBS.

Property – Hiccup with contactor on North AC unit. Doug fixed it and is running, Doug says Parsonage yard grass looks ok for now, about 37,000 sq ft could be reseeded. Allen called the exterminator about bait stations; hasn't been getting a bill, was just wondering. Summitt Fire will check fire extinguishers when he comes to elementary school.

Food Stand – Meeting report included in Treasurer's Report.

OLD BUSINESS

- ~ Lay leadership – touched on visitations, need to gauge interest in goals and objectives for Lay Leadership in the form of preaching, see who is interested. Discussion tabled for now.
- ~ Scott re-worked letter about church as a shelter and will present to campers.

NEW BUSINESS

- ~ Parsonage – may do walk-through about a sagging issue on a support beam reported by Pastor Mark with Property Committee.
- ~ Brotherhood Mutual guidelines – Scott consulted with Beth Roelfs, she thought that anyone involved should maybe attend a meeting for just this specific thing. Pastor has some training on this already, and can give Synod perspective as well. Put together a meeting in August about this issue.
- ~ Propane contract was discussed – with money situation, we felt we shouldn't contract at \$1.70 when cash price right now is \$1.57. It was moved by Charlie to not contract the propane and was seconded by Brian. Motion passed.
- ~ Food Stand extra food – we will communicate with Christian Ed committee and discuss, so vote was tabled on the subject. Leaning toward donating food to VBS.
- ~ Auditors were discussed, need to have in place earlier this year. Jamie will bring this up to congregation at a Worship service.

The next council meeting was set for Wednesday, August 19th at 7pm and the committees will meet at 6:30pm. Briana moved to adjourn the meeting and Jamie seconded. The meeting was adjourned and closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Carried and Called to Follow

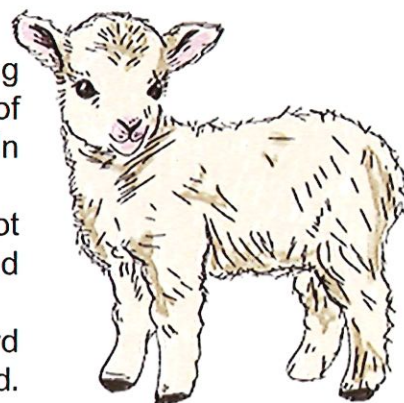
