Luther's Donkey Theology

This year I'm going to make some effort this year to bring some of Martin Luther's theology for your consideration during the 2022 Lenten Season. So, to wet our appetite, here is a quote of from Luther on what it means to be a Christian using our friend the donkey as a metaphor.

One of the great gifts of the spiritual life is the ability to poke fun at yourself. Here is a great example of Luther poking fun at himself.

"If however, you feel and are inclined to think that you have made it, flattering yourself with your own little books, teaching, or writing, because you have done it beautifully and preached excellently; if you are highly pleased when someone praises you, if you perhaps look for praise, and would sulk or quit what you are doing if you did not get it—if you are of that stripe, dear friend, then take yourself by the ears, and if you do this in the right way you will find a beautiful pair of big, long, shaggy donkey ears. Then do not spare any expense! Decorate them with golden bells, so that people will be able to hear you wherever you go, point their fingers at you, and say, "See, See! There goes that clever beast, who can write such exquisite books and preach so remarkably well". That very moment you will be blessed and blessed beyond measure in the kingdom of heaven. Yes, in that heaven where hellfire is ready for the devil and his angels.

To sum up: Let us be proud and seek honor in the places where we can. But here the honor is God's alone, as it is said, "God opposes the proud, but give grace to the humble"; to whom be glory, world without end, Amen

You've got to love donkey theology.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Gary presented the Treasurer's Report. Gary reported that there was a total available cash of \$9,408.87 in the account. Still needing to be paid are Norris Public Power and Portico leaving an ending balance of \$6,613.30. Darin moved to accept the Treasurer's Report as presented and Diane seconded. The Treasurer's Report was approved.

MEMORIAL TREASURER'S REPORT

Darin reported that there was an interest payment on the account of \$.91. The balance in the account is now \$14,152.80. Peggy moved to accept the report and Gary seconded. The report was approved.

Minutes for the Annual Meeting of St. Paul Lutheran Church, ELCA, January 31, 2021

The 2021 Annual Meeting was called to order by president Jamie Schultis. There were 28 congregational members present. Pastor Mark Liscom opened the meeting with a prayer. The minutes from the 2020 annual meeting were reviewed. David Henrichs moved to approve the minutes and Darin Weers seconded. The minutes were approved.

NOMINATING COMMITTEE AND BALLOT REPORT

- Jamie presented the church council ballot. On the nominating committee were Jamie Schultis, Melvin Beran, Beth Roelfs, Alan Roelfs, and Charlie Barber. Nominated for council were Peggy Hemphill and Diane Wellsandt. Nominations were opened for other names.
 No other names were mentioned. Beth Roelfs moved to cease nominations and Marcie Barber seconded. Nominations were ceased.
- Jamie explained the Diller Picnic Foodstand ballot and how funds would be divided accordingly.
- Gary explained the annual budget. Projections were very close last year and council will work toward keeping it close to the same for 2021. Angie Clifford made the suggestion that there be something added in the newsletter about how envelope donations and cash donations were distributed. Chris Clifford asked about Pastor's salary increase. Marcie Barber inquired about why benefits went down. Pastor Mark explained that they go up and down each year depending on circumstances, which is why it would reflect the lower benefits package. Charlie Barber moved to accept the budget and Beth Roelfs seconded. The budget was approved.

- Pastor opened up with a letter from the bishop regarding Covid and changes in the church
- Re-enforced our church's mission statement and vision plan.
- Gave a message for all of those we lost in 2020.
- Highlighted some goals for 2021.
- Shared some progress that was made from the Envision Committee' Report

Marci Barber, Chris Clifford and Stacy Roelfs were the 2020 auditors. The auditors found the books to be in order. The committee made a suggestion to hire someone full time to handle the treasurer's books and correct errors.

- Beth Roelfs wanted to give a thank you to Jamie Schulis and his family for his time served on the council and their work in the church.

OLD BUSINESS

Youth from our church that were selected were David Parde and Joely Weers.


