Confinement

Confinement is not a word that most of the time we view in a very positive way. It's associated with small spaces with not much room. You can feel it sometimes when getting on an elevator or walking onto a packed airplane. To be confined is to be stuck in a box, and unable to do the things that you might like to do.

The opposite of confinement is usually understood as something like freedom. If you're confined on the airplane, you can take your seatbelt off and "move about the cabin". It's getting out of the hospital. It's the freedom that the kids feel on the last day of school. If it's one thing that we celebrate in our culture it's that kind of freedom.

But during the season of Christmas, we are asked to think more deeply about this. For at Christmas we celebrate that God, who was completely free, was willing to confine himself. Jesus took on the confining nature of a human form. Jesus gave up his freedom, to be with us. So confinement, in the context of Christmas isn't bad...it's a gift.

In Galatians 5:1 Paul writes, "It is for freedom that Christ has set us free". Christmas asks us to understand that maybe what true freedom is about involves confining yourself. Take getting married or having children. They all involve giving up your freedom, confining yourself, for the sake of someone else.

And so it's a strange paradox. Sometimes "doing whatever we want" doesn't bring much freedom. But being willing to give up our freedom, to "confine ourselves" brings great freedom. It's worth thinking about at least, and maybe even learning to live.

St. Paul Lutheran Church Council Minutes for December 18, 2019

Jamie called the meeting to order. Members present were Jamie Schultis, Pastor Mark, Charles Barber, Allen Roelfs, Darin Weers, and Tyler Wolken. Doug Schmidt asked to join the meeting to discuss the proposed lighting situation. Doug shared with the Council a few lighting options and price points. Diller Electric has agreed to help with the installation of the lights at minimal cost. The Council agreed to move forward with this project, but will wait til until everyone on the Memorial committee and donors have been contacted. Pastor Mark gave a prayer to begin the meeting. The Council reviewed the minutes. Allen moved to accept the minutes and Charles seconded. Minutes were approved.

Financial Treasurer's Report

Allen reported that current balance in the account was \$3261.09. Norris, Solution One, and annual organist salaries still need to be paid. Darin moved to accept the treasurer's report. Charles seconded. Motion passed.

Memorial Treasurer's Report

Darin reported that the account had accrued \$2.12 in interest. This brought this balance to \$13,326.98. Jamie moved to accept the memorial treasurer's report. Allen seconded. Motion passed.

4 worship services, 3 confirmation classes, 2 confirmation make up classes, 1 youth meeting, 2 faith formation meetings, 2 choir rehearsals, 1 cluster meeting, 2 hospital calls, 5 communions, 5 other calls, 1 spiritual direction meetings, 1 drinking form the well webinar, 1 baptism/pre-baptism meeting, and 1 new member Sunday.

Vice Chairman's Report

Jamie reported that the Crosswalk program had an afternoon of fun with some of the older members of the congregation. 14 members, 22 Crosswalk kids, and numerous helpers were in attendance. They shared what Crosswalk has been up to, snacks/drinks, as well as a gifts the members. The youth performed a song that they do each week and was wrapped up with a group prayer. Thanks to all who made the day possible and a great success. Lastly, Jamie wanted to thank the volunteers who have helped coordinate and prepare the kids for the Christmas program coming up Dec. 24.

Norma called our meeting to order. Minutes were read and approved. Members answered roll call. Our offering was \$7.00.





After the Benediction, the Youth served refreshments. This program is becoming a favorite tradition to begin the season of Advent.




