The Fuss Over Rulers

"In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Ceasar—when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, Herold tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of Iturea and Traconitis, and Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene—during the high-priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas.......

.....the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness." (Luke 3: 1-2)

Simple question. Why do we make such a fuss over our rulers? Here in this country, the amount of emotional energy that is spent on our president is simply astonishing. But if it's not our president, it's the queen of England, or Prince Harry that people seem fascinated with. People glue themselves to these leaders hanging on their every move, willing to believe anything they say, defending them no matter how ridiculous.

It was the same in Jesus day. Caesar, Pontius Pilate, Herod, Philip, all seemed to hold in their hands the hopes of the people. They were worshipped and fussed over, just like our leaders are today. Everybody thought they were the vital pieces in the foundation of the future, and argued and fought over who would rule next.

The opening of Luke's Christmas story makes a simple point. God isn't found in any of that. Instead, God shows up somewhere else. Out in the wilderness. Stop investing so much of your time and attention fussing and fuming over rulers. God is somewhere else.

This Christmas season, make sure you spend some time in the wilderness. Refuse to get caught up in all the stress over our leaders if you can. If Luke is right, your answer isn't there, and will never set you right. Turn down the yelling and the accusation and the rumors and the crowds with signs.

Head to the wilderness. For it is there where God shows up. As we will hear sung in the Christmas story again this year......How silently, how silently the wondrous gift is given.

New Business: Work Day is on the 24th.








St. Paul's Congregation observed All Saints Sunday during the November 1st Worship Service.


We give thanks to God today for all their lives and for the love of God that is stronger and more enduring than death.
