A lot of us have been sick lately. I got it too. It hasn't been that bad, but the thing about this kind of virus or whatever it is, is that it doesn't go away very fast. It's been almost a month since I got whatever I had and I still have a little something that isn't quite gone yet. But it is, in fact, getting better. Some days it was hard to feel like I was getting better. But over time, day after day of dealing with it, I began to realize that I wouldn't have this virus forever.

Usually whatever healing needs to happen takes time. Even if you get a cut on your finger, it's not instantly cured. But over time the healing takes place and usually virtually unnoticeable.

I think this is a great approach thinking about prayer. Prayer is essentially request. So let's say say that you have something in your life that you would like some help with. So you ask God to get involved in it and offer whatever help is needed.

You have to keep in mind, that it will take some time. God usually doesn't give instant answers. Instead, it's like getting over a cold. It just takes a while. Usually before God can answer any prayer you have, you yourself will have to be prepared for the answer. That takes time. Then, slowly, maybe even imperceptibly you will realize over time that you are indeed getting help.

So stick with it. Stay with it. That's the key. It's a way of life, not something tacked on to a busy schedule. The answer comes, often in a way that you may never have expected. But one day you'll realize, that something has been at work in you for a while. Making things better.



St. Paul Lutheran Church Council Minutes for January 16, 2019

Pastor Mark opened with a reading from Romans and a prayer. Members present were Melvin Beran, David Henrichs, Cindy Lottman, Allen Roelfs, Jean Schmidt, and Jamie Schultis. Jamie made a motion to correct the minutes from December, 2018, to change the memorial treasurer's balance to \$13,317.38. An error had been made when stating the balance at the meeting. Allen moved to accept the amended minutes, and Jamie seconded. Motion passed.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Allen reported that the current balance is \$8,109.65. All outstanding bills have been paid, including Portico and Pastor Mark's salary. Other monthly bills will be paid by the end of the month. There was a donation to Stanton Propane for payment of the bill to St. Paul for delivered propane. Jamie moved to accept, and Cindy seconded. Motion passed.

MEMORIAL TREASURER'S REPORT

Jamie reported that the current balance is \$13,319.64, including the month's interest. No financial activity for the month. The year-end report for the endowment fund showed a fourth quarter loss and a year-end balance of \$17,570.94. Allen moved to accept, and Melvin seconded. Motion passed.

PASTOR'S REPORT

Pastor Mark presented his report, no written report available. No mileage.

- Pastor Mark and Megan have met to discuss a mentor for the Vision Team. No mentor has been found to serve.
- Transformational committee will be attending the upcoming meeting in Lincoln.
- Pastor Mark will attend a conference on February 2, 2019, in Grand Island with one congregation member.
- Synod would like Pastor Mark to attend a retreat in Arizona on February 4-11, 2019. Pastor will not be here for the Sunday service on February 10, 2019; Pastor Mark will contact a supply pastor.
- Pastor Mark is working on Lenten services. Pastor has signed up for the round robin services again. Confirmation during Lent may be held on Sundays.

COMMITTEE REPORT

- Memorial--met with family to discuss possible new lighting for the church.
- Nominating--is working on completing the annual meeting voting ballot for council and nominating committee members.
- Property--has repaired the ceiling tiles from the water/snow damage in the front of the church.

OLD BUSINESS

- Council continued discussion on changing the bank accounts from Fairbury to State Bank of Odell. Council decided to discuss switching banks at the annual meeting with the congregation.
- Council continued discussion on printing the newscaster and using an electronic version for congregation members who would prefer an online instead of paper copy. Council decided to discuss the two options at the annual meeting with the congregation.

NEW BUSINESS

- An individual who was seated on the Vision Team has accepted a nomination for Church Council. If elected, they will not serve on the Vision Team. Another volunteer has been found to replace the individual. The council agreed to seat the volunteer as part of the Vision Team.
- Council discussed Pastor Mark attending a retreat in Arizona. Allen made a motion to allow Pastor Mark to attend the retreat at Mesa, AR, from February 4, 2019, through February 11, 2019, with a supply pastor on Sunday, February 10, 2019. Cindy seconded. Motion passed.
- Council discussed having meals before the Lenten services again this year. Council decided since it was well received and provided a positive experience, it would be worthwhile. Council will make a final decision at the next meeting.

The next council meeting will be on Wednesday, February 20, 2019, at 6:00 p.m. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer. Jamie made a motion to adjourn, and Melvin seconded. Motion passed.

Minutes for the Annual Meeting of St. Paul Lutheran Church, ELCA, January 20, 2019

The 2019 Annual Meeting was called to order by council president David Henrichs. There were 58 congregation members present. Pastor Mark opened the meeting with prayer. Minutes from the 2018 annual meeting were read and reviewed. Beth Roelfs moved to accept the minutes, and Gary Bergmeier seconded. Motion passed.

NOMINATING COMMITTEE AND BALLOT REPORT

- Marcy Barber presented the church council ballot. Nominated for council were Darin Weers and Tyler Wolken. Nominations
 opened for other names. No other names. Ardith Barber moved to accept the council ballot, and Kendra K. Weers seconded.
 Motion passed.
- Marcy Barber presented the nominating committee ballot. Nominated for the nominated committee were Jim Damrow, Jamie
 Hennerberg, and Scott Pretzer. Cindy Lottman and Allen Roelfs, council representatives, will be members. Nominations opened
 for other names. Beth Roelfs volunteered to serve on the nominating committee. Having no more nominations, nominations
 ceased.
- David Henrichs clarified that auditors are not voted on as stated in the agenda. The auditors are appointed by the council.
- Marcy Barber explained the Diller Picnic Food Stand ballot. If operating the food stand, vote for one: 80% to the general fund or 60% to the general fund. If the 80% vote passes, the remaining 20% will be sent to top vote from 1 of 3: Benevolence, Blue Valley or World Hunger. If the 60% vote passes, the remaining 40% will be divided between the top 2 votes: Benevolence, Blue Valley or World Hunger.
- Allen Roelfs explained the 2019 proposed budget vote. Pastor Mark's salary will increase. The increase is in line with the recommendations of the Synod/rate of inflation. A big change will occur with Pastor Mark's insurance. Pastor Mark's insurance now only provides for his coverage. Other family members are now covered under insurance not paid for by St. Paul Lutheran Church. Council had checked around for alternative insurance options. At this time, no better choice was found. Council reduced some budget lines to be more realistic in amount. Discussion about the budget followed. After the discussion, Kevin Sasse made a motion for a ballot vote to pass the budget on a line-by-line basis. Karter Sasse seconded. David Henrichs explained what a line-by-line vote meant. Barb Sasse made a motion to amend the motion to a vote to pass the budget on a category-by-category basis. Karter Sasse seconded. Voting took place.

PASTOR'S REPORT

- What is the business of the church? The business of church, is participating in what God is doing in the world.
- Nebraska Synod Listening Team. This year St. Paul Lutheran Church had the bishop, assistant to the bishop, and a listening team of pastors listen to concerns of the congregation. The outcome was generally positive.
- Transformational Ministry Committee. Transformation is a spiritual process. It is doing the work to open ourselves to that transforming vision.
- St. Paul Vision Committee. A team has been created to work with Pastor Mark, the council, and the congregation to define goals and objectives with time frames and measurable outcomes.
- Our programs continue to be involved in activities. The groups include youth group, confirmation, and Adult Education.
- This year's Mission Festival was very engaging and encouraging.
- Thank you to everyone who works to make the church happen and supports this ministry. Pastor Mark.

AUDITOR'S REPORT

Dean Pretzer, Stacy Schlichtman, and Marcy Barber were the 2018 auditors. The auditors found the books to be in order.

VOTING RESULTS

- The first vote was on the amended motion to vote to pass the budget on a category-by-category basis: yes--18; no--37.
- The second vote was on the original motion to vote to pass the budget on a line-by-line basis; yes-12; no-41.
- Elected to church council: Darin Weers--55; Tyler Wolken--55.
- Elected to nominating committee: Jim Damrow--56; Jamie Hennerberg--56; Scott Pretzer--56; Beth Roelfs--53.
- If asked to operate the Diller Picnic Food Stand: yes--51; no--1.
- Funds from the Diller Picnic Food Stand would go to: 80% general fund--42; 60% general fund--13. 20% to Benevolence--18; 20% to Blue Valley--25; 20% to World Hunger-11.
- Proposed Budget: yes-41; no--13

David Henrichs opened a discussion on the church moving accounts from Fairbury to the Odell State Bank of Odell. After discussing options, David Henrichs asked for a vote by show of hands for interest in moving the accounts. A positive response was shown. Not all accounts will/must be moved.

David Henrichs opened a discussion on receiving the Newscaster electronically. After discussion, David stated that if a member of the congregation would like to receive only an electronic version, they should request to have their name removed from the mailing list.

Jamie Schultis informed the congregation the memorial committee is working on possibly installing new lighting in the church. Nothing definite has been planned, but memorial funds will be used if the project is completed.

Ardith Barber acknowledged the two resigning work group leaders and stated that there are two new work group leaders.

David Henrichs reported that the damaged ceiling tiles have been replaced. David Henrichs reported that the safe combination had been found and the safe opened. David Henrichs reported the members of the Vision Team had been seated. Those members include:




Pastor Mark and some of our youth accept the \$250 grant from the Diller Community Foundation Fund at their annual Granting Ceremony


