St. Paul Lutheran Church Council Minutes for February 10, 2021

Members present were Darin Weers, Gary Bergmeier, Diane Wellsandt, Peggy Hemphill, Pastor Mark Liscom, David Henrichs, Jamie Schultis, and Tyler Wolken. Not present was Melvin Beran. We started off the meeting by sharing God sightings with the group. The minutes were reviewed. David amended the minutes from January to have Dennis Nippert and Scott Pretzer be changed to the Nominating committee, not being nominated for church council. Gary seconded the amended motion. The minutes from January were approved.

Election of Officers

<u>Vice Chair- Peggy</u> nominated Darin. Darin nominated David. Jamie moved to cease nomination and Tyler seconded. A vote was taken. 5- David 3- Darin. David Henrichs was elected as Vice Chairman.

<u>Treasurer-</u> Gary nominated himself. Darin moved to cease nomination. Diane seconded. Gary was elected as treasurer.

Secretary- David nominated Tyler. Gary moved to cease nominations. Diane seconded. Tyler was elected as secretary.

<u>Memorial Treasurer</u>- Gary nominated Darin. David moved to cease nominations. Peggy seconded. Darin was elected as memorial treasurer.

<u>Financial Secretary</u>- Darin nominated Peggy. Gary seconded. Darin move to cease nominations. Jamie seconded. Peggy was elected as financial secretary.

<u>Financial Reporter-</u> Jamie nominated Diane. Tyler seconded. David moved to cease nominations. Darin seconded. Diane was elected as financial reporter.

Vice Chairman Report

Jamie wanted extend a thank you to everyone on council and appreciated his time spent on council. Jamie also wanted to thank Diane and Peggy for stepping up and offering to serve on council.

Treasurer's Report

Gary reported that the balance in the account after the additions from the January givings had a balance of \$17,589.12. Still needing to be paid are Pastor's salary, Norris, Portico, World Hunger, and Benevolence. This would give us an approximate balance of \$11,126.71. Darin moved to accept the treasurer's report and Peggy seconded. The report was approved. Since we came short of our Benevolence giving for 2020, the council discussed pulling funds from the Thrivent account to put towards the Benevolence line item. Tyler made the motion to use \$2500.00 from the Thrivent account to put towards the 2020 Benevolence and the rest would come from the general account. Peggy seconded the motion. The motion was approved.

Memorial Treasurer's Report

Darin reported that the account had an interest of 0.39 and with a recent memorial donation brought the account balance to \$9,105.84. Diane moved to approve the report. Tyler seconded. The memorial treasurer's report was passed.

Pastor's Report

3 worship services, 1 annual meeting/report, 3 confirmation classes, 3 confirmation make up classes, 1 first communion class, 3 hospital calls, 2 text studies, 1 Lenton series preparation. Pastor is working with $3 - 6^{th}$ graders on first communion and acolyte preparation. Lenton services will begin Wednesday, February 17th at 7:30PM.

New Business


- Darin suggested we look into (PPP) Paycheck Protection Program. This program helps provide loans to help businesses keep their workforce employed during the Covid-19 crisis. Borrowers may be eligible for PPP loan forgiveness. Tyler agree to check with State Bank of Odell to see if they offered a program like this.
- As approved by the congregation at the annual meeting, the council will be seeking candidates to fulfill the paid treasurer position. Diane made the motion that a subcommittee of Gary/Daivd/Pastor Mark work together to meet with potential candidates and they will set up the job description criteria. Darin seconded the motion. The motion was approved. Gary made a second motion to authorize the subcommittee to determine terms of compensation. Peggy seconded the motion. The motion was approved.


