Home vs. Hotels

What's the most important difference between your home and a hotel? I think the answer would be that if you have a home, you can make it the way that you want it to be. You can decide what kind of furniture you want for example. The paint on the walls, the kind of appliances you prefer. And most importantly, if there are changes that you want to make, you can make them.

A hotel on the other hand is the just the opposite. Your welcome to be there, but now you can't change anything. If you decide you don't like the curtains or the picture on the wall and change them, you'll be in big trouble. Really, all you can do is sleep there, maybe watch TV, and have some fellowship. But you can't change anything.

When we welcome God into our lives, are we giving God a home, or a hotel? Sometimes I think we put God up in a hotel. He might be there for when we need him, or maybe once a week on Sunday morning. But it's very much like the welcome given by your hotel staff. It's warm and friendly....but don't change anything.

But that's not the deal when it comes to God. When we ask God into our lives, we are asking God to make his HOME with us. We're asking God to do the decorating, and God to make the changes in our lives, families, or church that He thinks need to happen. Being open to that is what we call salvation.

In Ezekiel 37:27 God says this to Ezekiel. "My dwelling place will be with them; I will be their God and they will be my people". Let's welcome God into our lives, our homes, and our church, let's not put God in a hotel. The promise is that God knows what He is doing, and will make our live, homes, and church into what they were meant to be.

The primary item of business was the election of a Bishop. Bishop Brian Mass was reelected to the post. The assembly also voted to approve the budget and considered several resolutions.

We stepped outside the walls of our congregation and saw that our journey and challenges are the same as many other church families and the synod. It was an honor to represent our church and everyone should prayerfully consider accepting the invitation to attend an assembly and be open to the Bigger Picture of our church.

Pastor Mark opened the meeting with devotions from Matthew 6 and a prayer. Members present were Melvin Beran, David Henrichs, Cindy Lottman, Allen Roelfs, Jean Schmidt, and Jamie Schultis. Minutes from the May meeting were reviewed. Cindy moved to accept the minutes, and Jamie seconded. Motion passed.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Allen reported that the current balance is \$19.65. All bills have been paid except for part of Pastor Mark's salary. The months of May and early June have not reported much weekly offering/income. The congregation needs to be informed of the financial situation. Jean moved to accept, and Jamie seconded. Motion passed.

MEMORIAL TREASURER'S REPORT

Jamie reported that the current balance is \$13,304.04, including the month's interest. There was no meeting or activity for the month. Allen moved to accept, and Melvin seconded. Motion passed.

PASTOR'S REPORT

4 worship services, 1 Vacation Bible School, 1 youth group meeting, 1 youth group canoe trip, 1 meeting with the assistant to the Bishop, 4 hospital calls, 5 home communions, 2 other home calls, 1 funeral/family meeting, 1 premarital meeting, 1 Synod Convention. 342 mileage.

Pastor Mark requested that expenses for Synod Convention be reimbursed to individuals that attended.

COMMITTEE REPORT

• Diller Picnic Food Stand--making a few changes to food stand this year: bottled pop in coolers with ice, freezer moving out front, and fridge placed in cooking area.

OLD BUSINESS

- Jamie contacted new nominee for auditor. Individual agreed to accept. Jamie moved to nominate Marcy Barber for the auditor position for the next three years. Allen seconded. Motion passed.
- Pastor Mark has contacted individuals interested in joining St. Paul's congregation. July 15 has been set as new member welcome and reception during church service with a luncheon to follow.
- David talked to Bishop Brian. The process of discernment for our congregation will begin with a Listening process. This will begin in July or August.

NEW BUSINESS

- Roach and mice traces have been found in kitchen. Council discussed having the area sprayed and decided to hire an exterminator. Individual will spray every three months, and council will decide how long to continue spraying.
- Allen contacted Portico about health insurance coverage for Pastor Mark and his family. Changing coverage would save on the premium paid. Council will continue to discuss options.

The next council meeting will be on Wednesday, July 18, 2018, at 6:00 p.m. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer. Allen made a motion to adjourn, and Jamie seconded. Motion passed.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Allen reported that the current balance is \$454.32. Portico due at this time has been paid; the Norris Public Power and SolutionOne bills and part of Pastor Mark's salary need to be paid. All other bills have been paid. The funds from Diller Community Foundation for Vacation Bible School and the proceeds from the Diller Picnic Food Stand should be received soon. Jamie moved to accept, and Jean seconded. Motion passed.

MEMORIAL TREASURER'S REPORT

Jamie reported that the current balance is \$13,306.15, including the month's interest. There was no meeting or activity for the month. A quarterly report for the endowment fund showed an increase in the balance of the account. Cindy moved to accept, and Allen seconded. Motion passed.

PASTOR'S REPORT

4 worship services, 1 funeral, 1 New Members Sunday, attended 1 funeral, 8 home communions, 1 other home visit, 3 hospital calls (2 in Lincoln and 1 in Omaha), no youth meetings, no confirmation. No mileage.

- Sunday School and Confirmation classes will begin in August around the time school starts.
- Planning an outdoor service with Sunday School Kickoff in September.

COMMITTEE REPORT

- Diller Picnic Food Stand--not much for pop, water, and food supplies left. Hamburgers, hotdogs, and polish dogs were used during New Members potluck. The remaining food could be used during Sunday School Kickoff/Outdoor Service meal.
- Property--pine tree to southwest of church has died and should be removed; parsonage yard has limbs to trim up and remove broken branches; trees east of church could be trimmed.
- Transformational--meeting planned.

OLD BUSINESS

- Exterminator has been called. Not sure if spraying has been done yet; no bill has been received.
- The letters to the congregation about the listening process have been mailed. The process will begin mid-August.
- New Members Service, reception, and luncheon was well received. People enjoyed the social aspect.

NEW BUSINESS

- The Women of the ELCA are putting together school backpacks. The group would like to get approval to request a freewill offering plate during coffee time for money to purchase supplies to fill the backpacks. Council gave approval.
- Stanton Propane sent a letter about program for price protection on propane. Council discussed whether to enter into a contract. Allen moved to contract 3,000 gallons with Stanton Propane at .20 down and the remainder due when delivered. Jamie seconded. Motion passed.
- Council held discussion on the usage and contract on the copier. Main usage results from weekly bulletin and newscaster. The monthly cost is expensive and council discussed alternative options. The church has a website found at www.stpauldiller.com.


Mission Work Day

To Susan Lawton and Cathy Lyons and their families in the passing of their brother, David Lyons. David passed away on Saturday, July 14.







