Do You Want To Get Well?

Let's say you went to the doctor with the flu. Your throat hurt, you had a fever, and your head felt like a chunk of cement. So you get to the doctor's office, sign your forms, and wait a while in the waiting room. Then someone takes you back to an examining room and you wait some more. Finally....finally the doctor arrives. But before he examines you he asks you this question: "Do you want to get well?"

My guess is that you might consider a doctor like that a bit rude, or unfeeling. It might even make you mad. What kind of a question is that to ask a sick person, "Do you want to get well?" Of course you do!

But that's exactly what Jesus asked a man at the Pool of Bethesda in John, Chapter 5. A man crippled all of his life had waited at a pool for over 35 years for a healing that never seemed to come. So why does Jesus ask the man that exact question: "Do you want to get well?"

I think the reason is that Jesus wants to take the man back into his desire. His wants. His hopes. He is more interested in healing the man's heart, than in getting him to walk. After waiting so long, it seems the man had given up on hope. Jesus is rekindling the man's desires and hopes for a better life.

Sometimes the school of hard knocks can take the wind out of your sails. Get you adjusted to normal without that hunger, that desire, that "want to", that hope that is life itself. But when God shows up, the healing begins by getting your "want to" back. And when you think about it, when that is alive and vibrant, you're in pretty good shape.

Do you want to get well? Do you dare to desire, to hope, to really want the presence of God? Once you get that, healing will be on its way.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Allen reported that the current balance is \$745.36. All bills have been paid except for the Portico and the Norris Public Power bill that need to be paid by the end of the month. Jean moved to accept, and Melvin seconded. Motion passed.

MEMORIAL TREASURER'S REPORT

Jamie reported that the current balance is \$13,301.78, including the month's interest. There was no meeting or payments made for the month. The endowment fund reported a small loss the first quarter. Council is unsure if any funds can be transferred to an interest bearing/CD account. St. Paul VBS

May 21 - 25, 2018

During the week of May 21 - 25, all children of the Diller community were invited to attend the 2018 Vacation Bible School adventure at St. Paul's Lutheran Church. Everyone, young and old were marooned on an uncharted island where kids learned that Jesus carries them through every storm of life and that they are rescued by Jesus! They learned to hold onto God's promises when they are lonely, they worry, they struggle, do wrong, and feel powerless.



DAY 1

BIBLE POINT: When you're lonely... Jesus rescues!

BIBLE STORY: Jesus tells parables about lost things. (Luke 15)


KEY VERSE: "The Lord will hold me close." (Psalm 27:10)

Each day started with Castaway Singing and God sightings. Students met the day's new Bible Buddy, which included Hope the leopard, Beacon the toucan, Rae the manta ray, Guac the iguana and Moe a sloth.

During Bible Discovery kids experienced the daily story in a hands on way. They prepared a meal for Jesus and his disciples and prayed with Jesus at the garden.

At the Imagination Station they would dive into science experiments that helped the 25 students think, explore, and discover. A friction experiment helped kids understand how worry is like friction that can stop us in our tracks. They made their own toucan and watched it hop and stop just like worry stops us.

Ship Rec Games allowed kids to go bananas for the energy packed games connected to each day's Bible point. Land Lubber Lacrosse and plenty of water produced many smiles and a lot of laughter. The Tropical Treats tied into each day's Bible verse.



DAY 2

BIBLE POINT: When you worry... Jesus rescues!

BIBLE STORY: Martina worries and complains. (Luke 10:38-42)

KEY VERSE: "The Lord comes to the rescue each time." (Psalm 34:19)

KidVid Cinema offered five stories of real kids dealing with the daily Bible point in their own lives. All castaways then reflected on their connection to the story and Bible verse.

Kids wrapped up every VBS session with an energy filled Sail Away Sendoff that included the Spot Light slide show, a clever retelling of the day's stories with their smiling faces. Lots of music, dancing, and an audience involving object lesson helped put a positive close to each day.

The Kid-to-Kid project was a collection of items for the area food pantries. Donations will be collected for a while, all donations are welcome. They can be placed on the raft that was made by Pastor Mark.

BIBLE POINT: When you're powerless... Jesus rescues!

BIBLE STORY: Peter and John heal a lame man in Jesus' name. (Acts 3:1-26)

KEY VERSE: "This is the same mighty power that raised Christ from the dead." (Ephesians 1:19-20)
