Pastor Mark opened the meeting with prayer and a reading/discussion from John 5. Members present were Charles Barber, Marcy Barber, David Henrichs, Cindy Lottman, Allen Roelfs, and Jean Schmidt. Minutes from the August meeting were reviewed. There was an error in the minutes printed in the Newscaster. The Newscaster read that Adam Roelfs was absent while the official minutes read that Allen Roelfs was absent. David moved to note the correction and accept the minutes and Marcy seconded. Motion passed.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Marcy reported that the current balance is \$-1,286.26. As many bills as possible have been paid; however, the September Portico, Benevolence, World Hunger, and part of Pastor Mark's salary have not been paid as well as a few other monthly bills. A congregational reminder that St. Paul is short of funds will be included in the bulletin. Jean moved to accept and Cindy seconded. Motion passed.

MEMORIAL TREASURER'S REPORT

Allen reported that the current balance is \$13,368.53 without the monthly interest. The new church sign has been set up and is being used. The remaining balance has been paid. There may be a few incoming bills from the expenses of installing the church sign. A big thank you to all involved in the process to remove the old sign and install the new one. Also thanks to Donna and Jim Damrow for seeding the grass and planting flowers near the sign! Marcy moved to accept and Jean seconded. Motion passed.

PASTOR'S REPORT

4 worship services, 3 confirmation classes and 1 service project, 2 youth group meetings, 4 hospital calls, 4 home visitations, 1 confirmation make-up class, 3 text studies, 1 Cluster meeting, 1 Bible Study. No mileage.

- There are 6 new confirmation students; classes have begun and are going well.
- Pastor Mark is working with students to prepare them for Communion Sunday in October.
- Youth group will continue to help with the church service the last Sunday of the month; Pastor Mark plans to use some of the adult ed. materials with the youth.
- Pastor Mark has a concern with sermon notes that have been part of the confirmation program in the past; are they serving a
 purpose or do they just make parents/students accountable for attending church services? Council discussed the necessity of
 sermon notes.

COMMITTEE REPORT

- Christian Education--Planned for Sunday School program and plans with Pastor Mark.
- Diller Picnic Food Stand--Final Food Stand numbers are in and have been deposited.

OLD BUSINESS

- Pastor Mark is finishing the explanation to print about the offering designations.
- Pastor Mark is working with those interested in being assistant ministers.
- There are a couple women's names to add to the usher list.


NEW BUSINESS


Warren's Community Table




