#### Do we want God to "take over"? Or set us free?

We often find ourselves in an interesting dilemma when it comes to the desire for God to be involved in the world. The issue is that we often want God to simply take over. "Bring us peace!" we might say, or "stop the tragedy caused by war". On a more personal level we might ask for God to get us a job or make it rain. In other words, we want God to just take over.

But here is the dilemma. We also want to be free. On Memorial Day, we will remember the thousands who have died for freedom and gave their lives so that we as people will not be ruled or dominated by any power. Paul writes in Galatians, Chapter 5, "For freedom Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery".

What we need to understand is that in Christ, God willingly gave up his position of power and control. He can't just act like a dictator or "take over' because in the process we would lose our human freedom, the very thing that makes us who we are. So, in Christ, God came to be with us, to be friend us, to be found in life as we actually have it.

You're not a puppet. God will not just pull the strings and "make you" do this or that. God will be with you wherever you are and whatever circumstance you are in. As your friend. So that in whatever situation you might find yourself, you might know what it means to be free.


