A full, everlasting and abundant life. Not on the basis of our effort or virtue or will power, but simply as a gift. God is making out of whatever situation we are in.....something new and good.

When nothing is going right, never give up.....on believing that our God will do for us what we cannot do for ourselves. That's what it's all about.

- Stanton Propane was contacted and a contract for propane was signed.


New Business


Mission Work Day


Next Unit Meeting Wednesday, November 8th at 7pm – Eunice Circle to provide program.




