St. Paul Lutheran Church Council Minutes for September 19, 2018

Pastor Mark opened with a devotional video on "The Me...I Want to Be." Members present were Melvin Beran, David Henrichs, Cindy Lottman, Allen Roelfs, Jean Schmidt, and Jamie Schultis. Minutes from the August meeting were reviewed. Jamie moved to accept the minutes, and Cindy seconded. Motion passed.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Allen reported that the current balance is \$1,546.52. The current bills will be paid by the end of the month, except for Pastor's salary which will be paid soon. Portico will be pro-rated because of the change of insurance (removing family members from pastor's coverage). The Diller Picnic funds have not yet been received. Council agreed the congregation needs to be made aware of the financial situation. Jean moved to accept, and Melvin seconded. Motion passed.

MEMORIAL TREASURER'S REPORT

Jamie reported that the current balance is \$13,310.74, including the month's interest. No financial activity for the month. The memorial committee met. A letter has been sent, to families that have memorial money, with suggestions for new memorials. Allen moved to accept, and Jean seconded. Motion passed.

PASTOR'S REPORT

4 worship services, 3 confirmation classes, 1 confirmation service project, 2 youth meetings, 1 meeting with the bishop and assistant, 5 home communions, 1 hospital call, 1 wedding and rehearsal, 1 cluster meeting, 1 women's group bible study, 3 adult education classes, 2 pre-baptism meetings and baptisms, 3 other calls. 150 mileage.

- Pastor Mark is planning an All Saints Day service for November 4, 2018, with memorial dedications.
- Pastor Mark is planning a Mission Festival service.
- Pastor Mark reported that confirmation and youth group meetings/projects have begun and are going well.

COMMITTEE REPORT

OLD BUSINESS

- Pastor Mark has not contacted individuals about becoming new members or assistant ministers.
- Sunday School kickoff & picnic with outdoor service was well attended and enjoyed by congregation members.

NEW BUSINESS

- Council discussed health insurance for Pastor Mark. Family members have been removed from pastor's coverage and the upcoming bill(s) will be pro-rated to show only pastor's insurance.
- Council discussed the dates Bishop Maas would like to meet with congregation about the listening process findings. The council decided on Monday, September 24, 2018.
- Pastor Mark would like to take the week of October 22-26, 2018, off for vacation, as well as one of the Sundays.

The next council meeting will be on Wednesday, October 17, 2018, at 6:00 p.m. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer. Allen made a motion to adjourn, and Jamie seconded. Motion passed.





Next Eunice Circle will be October 8, 2018 at 1:30pm, October book. Norma Banahan will be study leader.




