# What Is Transformational Ministry?

Maybe you have heard some talk about the "Transformational Ministry" Committee and some of the work that's been happening there. Recently we merged this committee with the Mutual Ministry Committee so we have 8 members or so.

What's all this about? I'll give two major themes here that we're working on.

- 1. **Membership to Discipleship.** The cultural drift of mainline churches has been toward getting people to become "members" and getting them to "come to church". Transformational ministry has as its focus inviting people to become disciples of Jesus Christ. The invitation is to grow in his presence and awareness of his work in our individual lives and the life of our church.
- 2. Behavior modification to character transformation. The cultural model of getting people to modify their behavior is through rewards and punishments. You work from the outside. People do the right thing because while they may not want to, they know they "ought" to. Transformational ministry is change from the inside out. You don't try to change the behavior, you change the person. It's heart change. That's where God is found and works.

Make sense? It's actually a fairly big change in focus. I'm beginning to work on it in my preaching and the committee has been doing pretty solid work in opening up to new possibilities. I'm excited at the potential for healthy change this year.

# St. Paul Lutheran Church Council Minutes for January 17, 2018

Pastor Mark opened the meeting with a "Parable of the Talents" and a discussion on the parable. Members present were Charles Barber, Marcy Barber, David Henrichs, Allen Roelfs, and Jean Schmidt. Cindy Lottman was absent. Minutes from the December meeting were reviewed. David moved to accept the minutes, and Allen seconded. Motion passed.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT

Marcy reported that the current balance is \$2,828.15. The Portico for December and January still needs to be paid. There is a propane bill to pay, and the organists need to be paid. Jean moved to accept, and Charles seconded. Motion passed.

#### **MEMORIAL TREASURER'S REPORT**

Allen reported that the current balance is \$13,292.89, including last month's interest. A report for the Mutual Fund shows growth last year. The balance increased \$2,023.33. Marcy moved to accept, and Jean seconded. Motion passed.

#### **PASTOR'S REPORT**

- 4 worship services, 1 Christmas Eve Service, 1 Christmas Day Service, 1 youth progressive supper, 5 calls, 2 home communions, 2 text study meetings, 1 Bishop election meeting, and 1 confirmation meeting. No mileage. Pastor Mark was gone one week to attend his father-in-law's funeral.
- Pastor Mark plans to attend the meeting in Beatrice to nominate individual(s) for Bishop and the election to be held.
- Ash Wednesday is February 14. Pastor Mark plans to be a part of the round-robin series during Lent. There will be visiting pastors for our Lenten services. Pastor Mark would like confirmation students to attend. And Pastor Mark suggested having a light meal before services.
- Pastor Mark is going to start a new focus during sermons, "Invite to Discipleship, Not Membership--Transformation".

#### **COMMITTEE REPORT**

- Christian Education--Sunday School is trying a new program and is enjoying it.
- Mutual Ministry--is working with Transformational Ministry and will become a part of the committee.
- Nominating--is working on ballot nominees for upcoming annual meeting.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

• Allen completed the paperwork to continuance of the permit for the church sign along Highway 8.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

- There is an old safe in the copy room. Council discussed opening it to see what is inside. Before hiring a locksmith, council will ask congregation if anyone knows how to open it.
- Council discussed the ballot for the upcoming annual meeting. There are no nominations for council. Nominations will come from the floor. Council will again propose to operate the Diller Picnic Foodstand with 60% of the proceeds going to the general fund, and the remaining proceeds going to 2 of 3: Benevolence, Blue Valley, or World Hunger.
- Council discussed Pastor Mark's suggestion to have a light meal before Lenten services. Council agreed to serve the first meal on February 21 and ask for other groups to volunteer to serve meals too.

The next council meeting will be on Sunday, February 18, 2018, following church services. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer. Jean made a motion to adjourn, and Marcy seconded. Motion passed.

### Minutes for the Annual Meeting of St. Paul Lutheran Church, ELCA, January 21, 2018

The 2018 Annual Meeting was called to order by council president Charles Barber. There were 33 members present. Pastor Mark opened the meeting with prayer. Minutes from the 2017 meeting were read and reviewed. Pastor Mark made an amendment to the section about salary: not really a requirement, but a recommendation when referring to his salary. David Henrichs moved to amend the minutes, and Dennis Schmidt seconded. Jamie Schultis moved to accept the amended minutes, and Stacy Schlichtman seconded. Motion passed.

#### NOMINATING COMMITTEE AND BALLOT REPORT

- Charles Barber presented the church council ballot. There were no nominations for the council. Charles stated that nominations would come from the floor. David Henrichs discussed what council does and serving on the council. Nominations opened. Jamie Schultis and Melvin Beran volunteered to serve on council. Allen Roelfs moved to accept the council ballot, and Dennis Hennerberg seconded. Motion passed.
- Charles Barber presented the nominating committee ballot. David Henrichs and Jean Schmidt, council representatives, will be members. Nominations and volunteers placed on the ballot were Marcy Barber, Jim Damrow, Deb Nippert, and Stacy Schlichtman. Franklin Damrow moved to accept the nominating committee ballot, and Dennis Nippert seconded. Motion passed.
- Marcy Barber explained the Diller Picnic Food Stand ballot. If operating the food stand, 60% of proceeds will go to the general fund. The remaining 40% will be divided between 2 of 3: Benevelonce (20%), Blue Valley (20%), or World Hunger (20%).
- Marcy Barber explained the budget ballot. Pastor Mark's salary will increase. The increase is in line with the
  recommendations of the Synod. David Henrichs stated the council had checked around for alternative insurance
  options. At this time, no better choice was found. Marcy Barber explained the breakdown of Pastor Mark's benefits.
- Stacy Schlichtman moved to approve the voting ballot, and Deb Nippert seconded. Motion passed.

#### **PASTOR'S REPORT**

- Transformational Ministry is a new concept for St. Paul Church. Pastor Mark feels it is important for our church and congregation. A Transformational Ministry Committee and the Mutual Ministry Committee have been working on this "discipline" and "where it will take us."
- Our programs continue to be involved in activities. These groups include: youth group, confirmation students, Sunday School, and Adult Education.
- The list goes on and on... and Pastor Mark says "Thank You" to everyone who, in any way, helps make our church, programs, and congregation work!

#### **VOTING RESULTS**

- Elected to church council were Melvin Beran and Jamie Schultis.
- Elected to nominating committee were Marcy Barber, Jim Damrow, Deb Nippert, and Stacy Schlichtman.
- If asked to operate the Diller Picnic Food Stand: yes--31; no--1
  - Funds from the Diller Picnic Food Stand would go to 60%--general fund; 20%--Blue Valley; 20%--World Hunger
- Proposed Budget: yes, 31; no-1

#### **AUDITOR'S REPORT**

Tim Scheele, Dean Pretzer, and Stacy Schlichtman were the 2017 auditors. The auditors found the books to be in order.

Charles Barber stated the annual meeting report includes committee summaries and encouraged everyone to read through the report.

Charles Barber discussed the safe in the copy room. The safe has not been opened for a long time. It would be good to see what is inside. We need to find someone that knows how to open the safe or get a locksmith to open it.

Kendra K. Weers stated that there are still open sponsorships for the newscaster in 2018.

Pastor Mark stated that he did not have any funerals at St. Paul, Kaye Schlake and Howard Perkins had passed away during 2017.

Many congregation members are owed a lot of thanks for everything that gets done for our church. Without all the volunteers and contributions, projects would not get completed. A big thank you to everyone!!

Pastor Mark offered prayer for himself and his family as well as for members of the congregation and their families. Franklin Damrow made a motion to adjourn, and Jamie Schultis seconded. Motion passed. Pastor Mark closed with prayer.

Please remember them in your prayers as they recover and heal.




