#### St. Paul Lutheran Church Council Minutes for April 20, 2022

Devotions were read and God sightings were shared by council members and then Pastor Mark started the meeting with an opening prayer. Minutes were read and Peg moved to approve as corrected (for removal of Seder Meal) and seconded by Gary. Minutes approved as corrected.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT

Our financial status is in good shape. There are no remaining bills for the month with a balance of \$10,834.28 with two Sundays to go in April. It was noted and will be announced in Church to thank the congregation for the support. It was moved by Diane and seconded by Jeanette for approval of the Treasurer's report. Motion passed.

#### MEMORIAL TREASURER'S REPORT

Jeanette reported that there was \$.81 interest received for a total account balance of \$12,045.74. The camera for streaming worship services was purchased and Diode was paid for the splitter antenna for \$2,042.67. The candle holder for the eternal candle is on backorder. Brian moved to accept the report and Gary seconded. The report was approved.

#### PASTOR'S REPORT

4 worship services, 4 Lenten services, 1 Youth meeting, 2 Confirmation classes, 1 graveside service in Beatrice, 2 calls, Maundy-Thursday service, Good Friday service, two-day leadership conference, 2 text study meetings, 1 Synod Zoom meeting in Wilber.

#### VICE CHAIRMAN REPORT

Dave asked if Easter went good with breakfast first and one service, council thought this year's format went well. Because of the number of people attending, people thought maybe we should have put reserved signs in back pews for those that didn't want to go to communion up front, may start doing this every communion Sunday. Dave read a letter from the Synod about honoring Pastor Mark for 30 years of Ordination at the Synod Convention. We are planning on the congregation honoring him for his 30 years on Sunday, June 5<sup>th</sup> with a potluck dinner. We are going to get flatbread for communion and are ordering more plastic communion cups. When visitors are present, it should be announced that communion is open to all.

Pastor will work on getting a "shotgun" microphone. We talked about the "cutting out" problem, and will try to get Diode to replace the cable when we do the camera update. Diode is waiting on parts to mount the camera and do the splitter. Gary moved to have Diode replace the Cat 5 cable to see if it will eliminate the problem, and was seconded by Brian. Motion passed.

Thank you to Doug Schmidt for cleaning the soot on the wall above the Eternal candle.

We may try to get a couple cordless mics in the future if it is not too expensive, there is room on the soundboard for them. May be part of a Memorial.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**


Confirmation will be May 1st. Peyton Denner will be confirmed.



Palm Sunday had children, Confirmation students and Youth waving the Palms at the beginning of the worship service and the Impromptu Choir sang during the offering.





This is a project everyone can donate to. The big jar sits just outside the sanctuary doors. Start collecting. A few becomes many, just as pennies become thousands.


#### VBS 2022 HAYDAY! Growing in Friendship with Jesus


